Small Farmer Symposium One of the Features at SC AgriBiz and Farm Expo

The Small Farmer Symposium at the 2016 SC AgriBiz & Farm Expo is designed to meet the needs of small farmers and to prepare them for the ever-changing demands of agriculture in the coming years. Presented by the S.C. Department of Agriculture and the Farm Service Agency, the symposium will be held Jan. 13 and 14 at the Florence Civic Center.

Beginning at 10:30 a.m. on Wednesday, Jan. 13, ArborOne Farm Credit will kick off the symposium. Van McCall of AgSouth Farm Credit will present business management tools for the beginning farmer. Topics include "Business Management Cornerstone: The Balance Sheet," "Planning to Avoid the Agony of Defeat," and "Managing Small Investment for BIG Returns."

While these subjects might appear to be dull or boring, McCall—who is known unofficially as the "Jeff Foxworthy of the South"—presents this material in a fun and easily understood manner.

The late afternoon session will be led by Jim Matson of Matson Consulting, a recognized national leader in the local foods industry. He will give a presentation on federal grants, various farm loan funding avenues, and funding opportunities. Matson, who has extensive experience in almost all facets of the grant process, has assisted clients to secure more than \$8 million in grant funds. Individual applications typically range from \$20,000 to a quarter of a million dollars.

The Thursday session will begin at 10:30 a.m., leaving early morning time for farmers to

visit many of the 140-plus exhibitors. Farm Service Agency representative Kenn Jameson and social media consultant Ashlee Newman will lead that session. Topics are "Grow your Business through Social Media" and "Tell the Farm Story through the Lens of New Technology."


As farmers embrace social media and many of the unknowns, Ms. Newman will explain the tools and skills they need to enhance their small operations through social media, and the use of drones, GoPro cameras, and other technology.

The Thursday afternoon session is designed to enlighten small farmers with information on agritourism and food for local markets. Farmers can choose one of two tracks to set themselves up for success.

Jackie Moore, Agritourism Marketing Specialist for the SC Department of Agriculture, will present "Agritourism – Growth Opportunities for South Carolina Farmers." Included will be an explanation on what agritourism is, plus a panel discussion from local farmers who will share how they turned their working farms into agritourism destinations.

In a concurrent session, SCDA Assistant Commissioner Martin Eubanks will explain the Farm to Table movement. Included will be discussions on food hubs, what local food buyers are looking for, and programs for SC Certified products.

Thankful for Farmers

Here's an understatement for you—2015 will be a year to remember! Rather than going from feast to famine, we've gone from drought to flood. Prior to the drought, we had a freeze in the spring. There's not much in the way of weather that our state hasn't faced this year, and somehow our farmers have managed to survive. This Thanksgiving, we give thanks for our South Carolina farmers and their overwhelming resiliency.

First there was the wet spring, followed by a long period of drought. Then in October, weather forecasters predicted the biggest rainfall event ever. On Oct. 2, it started to rain, and rain, and rain—perhaps a bit like the Biblical flood of Noah's time. By the end of that historic weekend, some parts of the state had gotten over 25 inches of rain. That's half our annual rainfall at one time! On the heels of devastating floods, as roads were being repaired and things were beginning to look up, it rained some more.

Whether your family selects the Virginia Pine for its sturdy branches or the Eastern Red Cedar for the traditional southern aroma, you will not go wrong with any selection. They are all great SC grown Christmas trees that will stay fresh for the holiday season if you follow some basic steps.

As soon as you get your tree home, place your tree in a bucket of water or a water base stand. It is recommended that a fresh, straight, ¼ inch or more cut across the base of the trunk be performed. This will ensure excessive dirt will not stop water intake. It is also recommended to select a tree stand that will hold at least one gallon of water and to maintain your water level daily to ensure tree freshness.

After the holiday season, recycle your Christmas tree by taking it to one of the many municipal recycle centers for mulching. You can also utilize your Christmas tree for soil containment or fish bed construction.
