

National Peanut Month

This month we celebrate the first day of spring, St. Patrick's Day and Easter, as well as National Peanut Month. While peanuts are relatively new as a major crop in South Carolina, they're gaining popularity with the more than 400 farmers who planted around 116,000 acres of peanuts in 2015. The outlook for 2016 continues to be optimistic with early estimates around 100,000 acres.

Yields are growing along with acreage. In 2012, farmers averaged between 2,500 and 4,000 pounds of peanuts per acre. Now, some farmers have reported yields of up to 6,500 pounds per acre. This increase is thanks in part to research done at Clemson University and the extension personnel working with our farmers.

The South Carolina Peanut Board invests in research projects with Clemson that develop new technologies to help farmers be more efficient. Some of their most recent research projects include weed management and the development of new disease and pest-resistant varieties, as well as exploring new cultural practices that help reduce losses from the digging process.

It wasn't that long ago that South Carolina had one peanut buying station. Currently we have 12 stations that are inspected by SCDA graders.

Project Offers Hands-on Learning for Farm Women

Annie's Project offers women a unique way to learn about managing family farms and to network with professionals and other women farmers.

Jennifer Stalford of J&J Family Farm in Clover participated in the program last year. "I wanted to take the next step with our farm, so I went. It was extremely beneficial. We were exposed to an incredible wealth of information."

In addition to hearing from experts on subjects ranging from social media to peril insurance, Stalford met other women farmers from a wide array of backgrounds. "Some of them were into row crops, some had chickens, some were organic farmers," she said. "They ran the gamut from farmers with thousands of acres to women with no land. We all learned from each other."

The four-day, three-night session was packed with information and resources they could all relate to, she said. "We had sessions all day, and in the evening we were still sharing with each other. We toured different farms, and it was really cool to see how other people are doing things."

The Stalfords have a 60-acre timber farm, plus honeybees, seasonal vegetables and mushrooms. "This had immediate benefits. One seminar was on marketing, so one of the first things I did was start a Facebook page," she said. "I also found out about Community Supported Agriculture, so now I'm using that, and I'm involved with a farm and



food coalition."

The women were exposed to information they could process right away or take home, Stalford said. "Everyone could tweak the information to benefit their own farms."

The next session of Annie's Project will be May 4-7 at the Baruch Institute in Georgetown.

The \$125 fee includes all activities, lodging, and meals. For a private room, the fee is \$250.

The next step in development would be to shell the peanuts here rather than haul them hundreds of miles to have that done. Rogers Brothers in Lydia as well as Birdsong Peanuts in Darlington are each considering building a facility for shelling.

Often referred to as the "caviar of the South," boiled peanuts are the official state snack of South Carolina. Records show that Americans were enjoying boiled peanuts as early as Colonial days. As the Civil War neared its end, bread and meat were in short supply, so soldiers roasted and boiled peanuts for much needed nutritional value.

I love to introduce boiled peanuts to our brethren from the North and West. Watching their expressions shift as they sample the first salty bite is always quite entertaining. And any proper Southerner will tell you that no summer trip to the beach is complete without at least five pounds of freshly boiled, South Carolina peanuts. They go pretty good with football tailgates, too. I used to think my mother was fond of boiled peanuts until I realized she just loved to cook them; so we'd stop in and eat until they were all gone.

Athletes the world over rely on peanut butter to provide long lasting energy for their competitive lifestyles. Whether you're a weekend warrior or a professional athlete, peanuts and peanut butter can be an important part of a nutritious eating plan for performance, recovery and well-being. And, peanuts do more than pack a punch of protein. Scientific evidence suggests eating 1.5 ounces of most nuts, including peanuts, daily as a part of a diet low in saturated fat and cholesterol may reduce the risk of heart disease.

The South Carolina Peanut Board will be on hand at the Cooper River Bridge Run on April 2nd, handing out dark chocolate peanut butter in squeezable packs to the runners as they cross the finish line. These packs are perfect for on-the-go snacking and make it easy to enjoy the protein provided by peanuts.

Whether you prefer your peanuts roasted, salted or boiled, know that South Carolina farmers are working hard to provide you with a tasty, healthy snack your whole family can enjoy!
