EQUINE INDUSTRY HAS POWERFUL ECONOMIC IMPACT

RECENT SURVEY SHOWS \$1.9 BILLION IN SC

South Carolina's equine industry contributes nearly \$2 billion and 29,000 jobs annually to the state's economy, according to a new study by the SC Department of Agriculture in coordination with the University of South Carolina's SmartState Center of Economic Excellence in Tourism and Economic Development.

The study finds that the economic impact of the equine industry in South Carolina has nearly quadrupled in the past 14 years. The online survey targeted horse owners, industry suppliers, and organizers of horse events. Actual expenses for horses was \$1.1 billion. Related, or indirect spending, bumped that figure to more than \$1.9 billion.

Jobs created by the equine industry are significant, with about 22,500 direct jobs and \$765 million in labor income. The multiplier effect—additional jobs created in the local economy—indicate an additional 6,000 jobs and \$244 million in economic activity.

By breed, Thoroughbreds comprise nearly 25 percent of horses in SC. Next are Quarter horses, at 16 percent. All other breeds, which were grouped

together in this survey, account for 58 percent. Popular breeds such as gaited horses, drafts and ponies were not specified, nor were grade horses, donkeys or mules.

When expenditures are broken down, racing and competition account for \$358 million annually. People spend \$287 million on pleasure horses and related activities. The other \$440 million is for land, buildings, equipment, labor, health and veterinary services, hotels and motels, and transportation.

The Palmetto State is known for year-around racehorse training, showing and trail riding, as well as seasonal polo and fox hunting. The SC Thoroughbred Owners and Breeders Association lists about 50 racehorse trainers and private racetracks in the state.

South Carolina has a long history of Thoroughbred and Quarter Horse racing. The Carolina Cup in Camden attracts world-class steeplechasers and can boast crowds of more than 50,000, while tracks like Ellore and Kingtree, which are family-owned businesses, pull in 4,000 to 8,000 fans at their annual races.

"The equine industry is a dynamic blend of tourism, entertainment, agriculture and cultural heritage that plays a critical role in South Carolina's identity and economy," said USC SmartState Center director Dr. Simon Hudson.



The research team, led by Hudson, included professors from the College of Hospitality, Retail and Sport Management and the Darla Moore School of Business.

Highlights of the recently completed study:

- 73,600 horses in South Carolina
- Annual impact of \$1.9 billion, supporting 28,545 jobs and more than \$1 billion in labor income
- 17,963 Thoroughbred horses in South Carolina
- Nearly 26 percent of all horse-related expenditures are for recreation and pleasure.

TOO MUCH OF EVERYTHING — SOMETIMES NOT A GOOD THING

Our farmers have become the most efficient in the world, but better production doesn't always mean better profitability. We're dealing with an ever-changing industry in which overseas competition, and record yields, play into market prices. Right now several of our markets are suffering from increasing supply and insufficient demand.

There are a couple of unbreakable laws. One is gravity; you drop something, and it falls. Another is supply and demand, and it applies to agriculture perhaps more than to any other industry. When there are good years with widespread high yields on crops, the commodity prices will move lower. When there is a bad production year with a shortage in yield, the markets can move higher.

The prices of our major commodities—corn, soybeans, wheat, cotton, peanuts, tobacco—are determined by the world-wide system of markets. Farming is one of the only businesses in the world that can't set its own prices for products sent to market. Even when their input costs are higher than the market value of the crop, there are few selling options when an operating loan is due.

Each month the USDA provides a crop report to give an update on the world market, with predictions on the volume of the sale of commodities. Due to large

stockpiles of wheat and soybeans, for example, farmers won't get as much for this year's current crops. Wheat might have to be used as a feed grain. That may be good news for our pork, cattle and poultry industries, but it means a lower profit margin for the farmers who grow wheat, corn and beans.

The USDA has reduced corn US export volume due to increased exports from Brazil and Argentina. Stockpiles of soybeans are around 900 million bushels, which is high. South America will be 10 million metric tons higher in production of soybeans and 23 million metric tons in corn, compared to last year. Supply and demand does not just depend on what happens on US farms.

The point to remember is that commodity prices are not determined by any individual farmer or even a group of farmers, but by the world market and the Chicago Board of Trade, which interprets all the components of supply and demand. The prices at the local gin or grain elevator here in South Carolina are then affected by what's called "basis," which has to do with the cost of the transportation of crops.

It's important for farmers to find a middle ground so they can be productive and profitable. So, what this means is that farmers have to diversify, and they have to plan ahead to do that.

No farmer wakes up one morning and says, "I think

I'll plant more soybeans." They have to study the global forecasts of the market, analyze all of their other crop options, see what field rotation can be utilized, make sure their equipment will be ready for the new acreage, and plan financing. And, yes, hope the weather cooperates.

The important thing is, farmers have to know a great deal beyond the agronomic science of crop production. When it comes to making the best market opportunities for a crop, my advice is to get good advice from professionals who understand what I have been sharing in this column.

One more unbreakable "rule." The markets will always find a balance between supply and demand. Your side of the equation—whether as seller or buyer—determines if you're happy with the results.

ANNIE'S PROJECT PROVIDES WOMEN FARMERS THE SKILLS TO SUCCEED

Aimed at teaching women farm management skills, Annie's Project is coming back to South Carolina for the eighth year. The program empowers farm women to be better business partners by managing and organizing critical information.

Clemson Cooperative Extension is offering the four-day program from May 14-17 at the Hampton Inn and Suites in Hartsville. The registration fee of \$100 per person includes all workshop materials and activities, lodging (double occupancy), meals and surprises. Single occupancy is also available at \$200 per person.

Annie's Project state coordinator Jennifer Boyles said the goal is to bring together women from all walks of life to build bonds through the common thread of agriculture.

"Many of our participants have been involved in farming all of their lives, while others are coming into farming from another walk of life," Boyles said. "Having the opportunity to bring together such a diverse set of life experiences allows these women to build relationships. By sharing those experiences with each other, they create a whole new network of farming friends."

Facilitated by experts in business and agriculture, Annie's Project takes a hands-on approach to delivering content, not just through lectures, but by using a unique method providing a retreat-style program in a relaxed setting.

The share of U.S. farms operated by women has nearly tripled over the past three decades. "As women take a larger role in operating farms, it's important that we equip them with the skills to not only be successful, but also give them the tools to turn their operation into a sustainable enterprise," Boyles said.

Topics include risk assessments, business planning, financial statements, family and liability insurance, farm programs, legal concerns, retirement and transition, and personal development.
