Compared to last week: Feeder steers and heifers are trading mostly steady to 3.00 higher. Steer and heifer calves trading on a limited test, except for the heavier calves bringing 2.00-3.00 higher. Quality average to attractive. Demand for both feeder cattle and calves remains moderate to good, especially for heavier feeder cattle that require less time in the feed yards. Recent moisture, although limited, has producers' thinking more intentionally about grazing decisions. Feeder supply included 60 percent Steers, 39 percent Heifers, and 1 percent Bulls. Feeder Supply over 600 lbs was 79 percent.										
Compared to last week: Slaughter cows mostly steady, lean cows 1.00 lower. Slaughter bulls steady. Packer demand moderate to good. A total of 293 cows and bulls sold with 47 percent going to packers.
