Pee Dee Field Day Shows Farmers How Research, New Technology Can Bring Greater Profits

Hundreds of farmers converged on the Pee Dee Research and Education Center last week to see the latest techniques in agriculture at the annual farm field day. Three tours highlighted research being done on cotton, soybeans, peanuts, sorghum, and bioenergy, with experts showing exactly how their results were achieved.

Examining dozens of test plots allowed growers to see first-hand how various crops can be managed most effectively. From insect and weed management in cotton to the use of sorghum as an alternate to dry-land corn, the demonstration plots showcased several row crops.

In the soybean field, for example, Clemson agent Ben Fallen invited farmers to observe soybeans that had been planted in two-week intervals, beginning April 28 and ending July 2.

He covered drought, genetic diversity, and several other topics, explaining that farmers can spread their risks by using different varieties and extending the planting season in both directions.

USDA specialist Phil Bauer explained the effects of lime on peanuts, while Clemson's peanut breeder, Shyam Tallury, exhibited sev-

eral varieties. Developing a new variety can take 10 to 15 years, but pollinating peanuts in greenhouses and using sister research centers in Puerto Rico could cut that time in half, he said

Another interesting tour focused on bioenergy and the research being done with switch grass and sorghum. Farmers were particularly interested in sorghum, which can be used as grain, meal, fodder, or fuel. Clemson's David Gunter explained that sorghum can be grown for about half the cost of corn. Yields are about 30 to 40 bushels per acre with little effort from the farmer, but he has pushed some of his plots up to 130 bushels. Other possible bioenergy sources are hybrid poplar, eucalyptus, and cottonwood, which are also being grown at the research center.

Farmers were encouraged to ask questions at every stop. Lunch speaker Gordon Mikell, SC Conservation Agronomist with USDA-NRCS, talked about advances in soil health and the use of cover crops. Research at the 2,300-acre farm focuses on crops grown in the Pee Dee which offer economic potential to the region.

Dirt Work Incubator Farm Awarded \$50,000

Dirt Works Incubator Farm on Johns Island received \$50,000 in a national contest to accelerate small business growth. Sponsored by the U.S. Small Business Administration, the contest had entries from 31 states.

Dirt Works Incubator Farm, started in 2012 as a first of its kind in South Carolina, provides three years of production and business support for participating farmers. During the last year of the program, farmers are matched with prospective land-owners to continue to expand their farm busi-

Dirt Works, a part of Lowcountry Local First, was selected from more than 800 applications for the SBA's Growth Accelerator Fund money. It is the only recipient in South

"It's refreshing for people to recognize that farming has an incredible economic potential, especially in South Carolina," said Nikki Seibert, Director of Sustainable Agriculture at Lowcountry Local First.

The money will be used to support program operations, equipment and personnel at the incubator farm.
