Budget Priorities

Like any household or successful business, we prioritize the use of our funds in the Department of Agriculture. To plan ahead, we estimate the cost of doing business and make a budget for the future. With the General Assembly preparing to reconvene, we have been busy compiling our budget priorities for the next fiscal year starting July 1 for funds that will be utilized to serve every South Carolinian and promote the agricultural industry.

This is an important task each year, as these appropriations will allow the department to improve its services to producers and consumers. Certain expenses are recurring, since we continually strive to make each mission of the Department more productive and innovative than the year before.

One request is for dditional funds to expand marketing efforts of the Certified South Carolina Grown program. Already showing huge results in state, this incredibly successful program has the potential to dramatically increase the sale of South Carolina products in other regions as well. It is a great partnership, as the farmers and agribusiness people who use the program invest their money as well to use the brand.

While people are advised to stay indoors during extremely cold weather, animals may not have that option. Animals that live outdoors are able to adapt to cold better than people, but they still need extra care when the temperatures drop drastically.

The following information was provided by the veterinary staff at Clemson Livestock Poultry Health to help you keep your animals safe and healthy this winter.

Livestock

• Livestock (cattle, goats, pigs, sheep) are generally able to acclimate to the colder temperatures that we face in South Carolina. They will often stay together for warmth or seek natural windbreaks such as stands of trees.

Manmade windbreaks can be placed in open fields if needed.

Most importantly, check water sources daily to break up surface ice.

• Ensure that animals have access to feed. Provide good quality hay daily if grass is snow-covered. In prolonged cold weather snaps they may need additional food to help them maintain body temperature.

All young livestock may need freezing. supplemental feed in winter months.

Horses Most horses can live outside in a cold winter without problems. Senior horses with issues associated with older age, such as arthritis, dental problems, weight loss and endocrine disease may be more sensitive and need extra attention. The following are recommendations: Provide adequate shelter, whether by natural windbreaks or manmade structures. This is especially important to protect horses from moisture and wind that may accompany cold temperatures. Ensure adequate and quality feed. Horses usually need extra calories in cold weather. Provide a con-@certified sc stant supply of high quality, dry, fresh hay.

Supplement the diet of geriatric horses, especially those with dental disease, with highly digestible senior diets or mashes.

Ensure that water is available at all times. Several effective methods are available that can be used to keep ice from forming in water troughs.

If blankets are used they MUST be checked frequently. Horses can become tangled in blankets that have slipped and they can also develop skin problems when moisture accumulates under blankets.

Back Yard Poultry

Provide a coop or house so birds can seek shelter. Temperatures slightly above freezing will keep chickens comfortable. Ensure adequate airflow to prevent humidity or ammonia build up. Place deep bedding and roosts in the coop. Beware of fire danger if using a heat lamp.

• Place roosts or logs in the yard to keep the birds up and out of the mud and ice.

• Petroleum jelly can be applied as needed to large combs and wattles to prevent frostbite.

Electrical heated buckets or water base warmers can be used to keep water from

• Feed good quality feed specific for your poultry type. In cold months you can supplement with scratch feed. Artificial lighting can be used to continue egg laying during the winter months. For more details: www.clemson.edu/-LPH/AHP/poultry management.html.

Pets

Healthy pets accustomed to being outdoors can acclimate to gradually increasing colder temperatures, but no pet should be left outdoors for prolonged periods in severely cold weather. Provide some options for them to

> stay warm, especially when temperature or wind chill produce temps in the teens or below.

To continue growing South Carolina's top industry, agribusiness development is a priority. We are in the process of recruiting and adding new processing facilities throughout the state, further developing food hubs, and more aggressively seeking prospective agricultural businesses. We will focus more support on the expansion of existing South Carolina businesses.

This year the Department is also asking for several one-time requests, including maintenance of the Greenville and Pee Dee State Farmers Markets. In order for the markets to continue to function as prime locations to buy local, fresh produce, they need a little work here and there, such as painting, roof repair, and renovation of wholesale space. We also hope to complete the landscaping at the State Farmers Market in West Columbia.

One request approved last year that we are particularly excited about is the construction of the new Metrology Laboratory. While this may be one of the lesser-known aspects of the Department of Agriculture, the Metrology Lab affects all consumers through the calibration of public and private weights and measures. New equipment is needed to make the laboratory compliant with federal guidelines and to maintain its high level standing in the National Institute of Standards and Technology. The new lab will be located on the State Farmers Market campus in West Columbia.

Funds are also being requested for the Ag in the Classroom program to develop new educational materials and update curricula. The Farm to Institution Program requires a permanent program manager, program coordinator, and consultant evaluation team. This initiative will expand market opportunities for farm-grown food in schools, hospitals, and government agencies. A recent grant funded pilot project produced \$100,000 in sales of S.C. poultry products in just one school district.

A part of planning ahead is looking at the past to see the effectiveness of what we're doing and whether to continue. Here are a few examples that we will continue based on past success.

Last year we showcased local ag products with our commodity boards at the state's two biggest college football games. Fans at Carolina and Clemson games were treated to new ways to enjoy fresh South Carolina meats and vegetables.

One of our new favorite events is the AgriBiz Expo in Florence. Now in its third year, the highly successful forum brings together every conceivable farm product with the newest technology and innovation. This event could serve as a model for agricultural expos across the country.

Another successful venture is the Chef Ambassador program, which recognizes outstanding chefs who are committed to using fresh food from local farmers. Agritourism is a relatively new program that provides a vital partnership between agriculture and tourism. Did you know that when you visit a pick-your-own vegetable farm, you're promoting both farmers and tourism?

Just like businesses, our agency experiences higher input costs, and must replace equipment. We plan to update our graphics equipment so we can produce in-house promotional materials, which saves the cost of outsourcing some print jobs.

I mentioned to our staff at our Christmas luncheon, our department does more for the people of S.C. with less money than any other state agency. But, when it comes to budgeting for the future, we have to be realistic about the costs to serve agriculture and the people of South Carolina.

As the 2015 General Assembly progresses, be sure to pay attention to the discussion about our state's revenues and our needs, and please take the time to express your support of

Horse Expo Offers Clinics, Demonstrations, & Education for Horse Lovers of All Levels

Expo on Feb. 14 offers education and entertainment for horse lovers of all ages. It will be held Feb. 14 at the South Carolina Equine Park in Camden.

The line-up includes demonstrators by the South Carolina Mounted Shooters, who will show off their horsemanship and target skills in this fast-growing equine sport. The Cedar Swamp Lancers will take spectators back in time as they perform lancing demonstrations in period costumes, and several draft breeds will be shown in hand, under saddle, and working.

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Bring them indoors (especially if very young or old, ill or arthritic).

Ensure outdoor enclosures have raised floors, doors turned away from the wind, and clean, dry bedding.

Check and change drinking water frequently to make sure it hasn't frozen.

Depending on the pet's body condition, some outdoor pets may need more food in winter months. Check with your veterinarian about your pet's nutritional needs.

Pets with very short or thin hair, or short legs that allow their bellies contact with the cold ground can benefit from a pet sweater or coat when outside.

Use extreme caution with space heaters, electric lamps, or pads because of risk of fire or burns.

Rap on your vehicle's hood to startle a cat that may have climbed next to the engine for warmth.

Prevent exposure to antifreeze or other chemicals which can be harmful or deadly.

Check paws for injuries from ice or deicing chemicals. Consult your veterinarian if you see signs of illness.

If power outages or frozen water pipes force your family to seek shelter, check websites for pet-friendly hotels (e.g., bringfido.com) and take along your pet emergency kit (carrier, food, water, medical records, medications), or arrange temporary housing at boarding kennels and veterinary offices.
