Seven Oaks Plant Shop *Locally grown plants are best for your garden*

Customers at Seven Oaks Plant Shop in Irmo know they are getting high quality, locally sourced plants, along with friendly service from a family-owned business.

That's one reason people were lined up at 7:30 a.m., in the rain, for the shop's 37th anniversary last month. General manager Mark McGrady said the true hard-core gardeners know that locally grown flowers, vegetables and herbs are the best choice for their gardens.

In fact, one new customer told Mark that she felt like returning everything she had bought from a big-box store. "We get to know people. We are seeing second generations shop with us. Relationships and the quality of merchandise are important," he said.

The family-owned business also has second generation employees among its 12 workers. "Our families are invested in this. What we set on the table reflects us, and it starts at production," Mark continued.

He estimated that 80 percent of their plants are grown in South Carolina. The Certified SC program has not only helped create brand awareness, it is also educating people about keeping their money at home. A lot of

consumers are seeking out Certified SC.

"People don't realize how many local flower growers there are in the state," he continued. "We do our part to keep it at home."

Right now the shop is deep into tomatoes, with about 60 different varieties of tomato plants on hand. Nearly half of those are heirloom tomatoes, which are known for exceptional flavor. Some 30 pepper varieties, three tables full of SC grown herbs, plus many other vegetables give home gardeners a tremendous selection of locally sourced edibles.

A rainbow of annuals and perennials, all SC grown, range from geraniums to hanging baskets, begonias and hundreds of ferns. Plants are offered at the right time of year, along with advice on growing.

The shop also sells Stout Ollie Compost from River Run Farms in Vance, a locally produced compost that is excellent for vegetable and flower garden beds.

Mark summed up his family's philosophy about their business: "We're not getting rich, but we're doing what we love." Seven Oaks Plant Shop is located at 4522 St. Andrews Rd., Columbia.

Trends in Agriculture

National Agriculture Day, which was March 18, is the day that recognizes and celebrates the abundance provided by our industry. Several events took place in Washington, DC. One was a presentation by a diverse panel of speakers on Capitol Hill giving their view on what the future holds for agriculture.

The "Farm to Fork" panel noted trends that farmers need to think about for the future. As one speaker said, "We're living in 2015, but we're thinking in 2050." Several key themes emerged from their wide-ranging discussion, and they are certainly worth considering.

First, producers must be careful about food safety and thoughtful about animal welfare. As one egg producer put it: "You are one egg away from going out of business if you sell an egg with salmonella." Some animal rights activists, intentionally or otherwise, give the misguided impression that farmers don't take good care of their animals, and that simply is not true. Farmers provide the best care possible for their livestock, not only because their livelihood depends on it, but there is also a time-honored bond between farmers, the land, and their animals. Healthy animals and healthy soil are beneficial to the bottom line of any farming operation.

Water represents a growing challenge for agriculture. Long term, sustainable use of water is a key concern for all farmers. As a growing world population increases demand on resources, greater efficiencies have been and will continue to be developed to ensure that water is available to meet human needs. The amount of water used to produce similar yields to those of 30 years ago is about half of what it was then.

The job market for agriculture grads is bright. We see this on a daily basis. Since agriculture and forestry represent the biggest industry in South Carolina, it stands to reason that more and more jobs are needed in diverse areas. Technology, mechanization, research, and agribusiness management are attracting huge numbers of college students, and many of them have jobs before they even graduate. Packaging Science is just one example of degreed programs available in our state that make an immediate impact on our lives every day. This is one of the reasons the Commissioner's School for Agriculture is so important to connect these careers with young people.

Additional funding is needed for ag science research. Technology and efficiency will enable us to meet the world demand for food and fiber. Time is the critical factor as it can take more than 10 years to bring new technology to market. Brazil and China are actually spending more on agriculture research than the United States. It is vital that we continue to support research at our land grant institutions that will allow the U.S. to compete at profitable margins in food and fiber production. Land and resources are finite, and technology will enable us to meet the needs of a growing population, estimated to be near 10 billion by the year 2050.

Farmers and other agriculture professionals must engage more with consumers. Social media can put out messages that aren't always accurate, and they often deal with emotional issues. While good science helps combat the negative messages, it makes sense to get our story out there in a positive way. There are people who make money scaring people about food, and that's not good.

Food producers need to tell our story of sustainability and stewardship. In years past, farmers were seen as consummate environmentalists. Some of that image has been taken away, and we should make an effort to restore our positive image.

National Ag Day is a good time to reflect on the history of farming, but also is the appropriate time to take a serious look at what's ahead.

S.C. Youth Win National 4-H Championship

South Carolina 4-H'ers won first place at the North American International Livestock Exposition in Louisville, Ky. in November, a national 4-H horse competition that tests equine science and management.

Six youths from across the Palmetto State won team and individual awards. South Carolina teams competed in two categories. Hippology, which literally means "study of the horse," and Presentation, which requires team members to demonstrate a horse-related topic using visuals, props and multimedia.

The hippology team, which placed first in the Eastern National 4-H Roundup Hippology competition, included Kristy Waldrep of Goose Creek, Hailey Mundell of Chapin, Hannah Steele of Chester and Aubrey Miller of Troy. In addition, Kristy was named reserve national champion in the individual contest, having missed the national championship by one point. Hailey placed eighth in the individual category.

The competition covers all aspects of horse knowledge from breeds, anatomy and physiology, to judging, equine management and marketing, to legal aspects of horse ownership and business skills. In the mandatory public speaking component, the team was given a problem and had to present the answer as a team, live in front of the audience and judges.

The presentation team, which finished fifth overall, included Ashley McCarter of York and Ashtyn Kinney of Greenwood. Ashley and Ashtyn were the first South Carolina

participants invited to speak at the event's awards breakfast.

Due to a tabulation error, the team was not immediately recognized as the winning team and the trophy had already traveled to Ohio. After much delay, the trophy finally arrived in South Carolina. The team was then honored by Clemson President James P. Clements and by the S.C. House of Representatives. Kristine Vernon is the 4-H coordinator at Clemson, and Melissa Brundage of Bishopville is the team coach who traveled to Kentucky with the girls.

State Rep. Gary Clary and the S.C. House of Representatives recognized the winning teams on the House floor and presented House Resolution 3330 in their honor. Additionally, Sen. Thomas Alexander presented the students with Senate Resolution 354 to recognize the teens' successful representation of South Carolina on the national stage.

McCarter, now a freshman studying equine science at Clemson, spoke during a House subcommittee meeting, telling lawmakers how 4-H opened her eyes to career opportunities and taught her lessons in leadership that will carry into her collegiate and professional careers.

"I couldn't be more proud to carry on the legacy of 4-H with my head, my hands and my heart," McCarter said.

Thousands of South Carolina youth are active in the 4-H Horse Program, participating in more than 5,000 horse projects from the club level up.
