
Pee Dee Farm Field Day Focuses on Latest Technology

More than 300 farmers took advantage of the Pee Dee Research and Education Field Day in Florence on Sept. 10. Clemson Cooperative Extension sponsors field days at its research centers across the state.

Participants could choose one or two tours that showcased various crops in the fields, along with top experts to explain the demonstrations. The first tour focused on grain sorghum, soybeans, peanuts, aphid management, and a drone demonstration. The next segment gave close-up views of vegetables, bioenergy fuels, weed management, forestry practices, cotton test plots, and a lecture on controlling feral hogs.

Test plots on 800 acres monitor crops in a variety of situations, from no irrigation to targeted irrigation, application of nitrogen, using specific amounts of lime, and many other factors depending on the crop. The results are carefully tabulated so that farmers will be better informed on which varieties to use, when and how much fertilizer and weed killers to apply, and how to better use technology in production.

Keeping producers abreast of the latest information is the basis for all the research and education centers.

Dinner will be served from 6 – 7 p.m., with remarks by Dr. John Mueller, director of Edisto REC. Pesticide and CCA credits will be available after the tour.

Agricultural Tour Showcases Ag Diversity

The tours offered by the SC Agricultural Council take people to interesting sites all over the state. The Upstate trip in September was one of the best ever, according to SCDA's tour organizers Jackie Moore and Laura Lester.

First was a visit to TR Potts Performance Horses near Fountain Inn. This brand-new training barn--which focuses on American Quarter Horses--features an impressive barn, a large covered arena, and a state-of-the art computerized horse walker. Potts relocated his operation to South Carolina from Connecticut last year.

Next was a visit to the Bart Garrison Agricultural Museum in Pendleton, which offers a historic perspective on farming that dates back nearly 200 years. The grounds of the museum also feature many interactive displays.

After a delicious lunch catered by Smokin' Pig, the group had two stops at Clemson University. First, master cheese maker Anthony Pounder demonstrated the step-by-step process of producing Clemson's famous blue cheese, which takes about six months.

A climb to the top of a building led to a greenhouse that houses innovative aquaculture and aquaponics research. Dr. Lance Beecher explained that not only can he raise tilapia, but the waste water from the tanks is used to fertilize a variety of vegetables in the greenhouse.

The last stop was Happy Cow Creamery, where tour-goers took home lots of fresh produce and locally grown food items.
