Chef Ambassadors Reflect Passion for Local Food

The Chef Ambassador program recognizes chefs from the Upcountry to the coast who embody the best of South Carolina's food scene, both in the quality of their provisions and their dedication to using healthy, locally grown ingredients.

The Chef Ambassadors for 2016 are Teryi Youngblood of Greenville, Ramone Dickerson of Columbia, Orchid Paulmeier of Hilton Head Island, and Forrest Parker of Mount Pleasant.

In its second year, the South Carolina Chef Ambassador program was an initiative Gov. Nikki Haley enacted after the concept was brought to her by Chef Brandon Velie, executive chef at Juniper in Ridge Spring. Chef Velie, a 2015 South Carolina Chef Ambassador, will serve as the advisor to the 2016 slate.

Chef Teryi Youngblood was named Chef de Cuisine of Passerelle Bistro when the Greenville restaurant opened in June 2013. With a menu full of French-inspired dishes, Chef Youngblood does not believe in complicated food. "I find myself inspired by my heritage and the abundance of fresh ingredients," she said. "I look forward to working with my fellow Chef Ambassadors to shine a spotlight on our destination dining."

Chef Ramone Dickerson owns Wing City restaurant and the 2 Fat to Fly food truck, both in Columbia. The stuffed chicken wings created by Dickerson and his business partner, Corey

Simmons, landed a reality TV show on the Oprah Winfrey Network last year called "Wingmen." Their unique approach to stuffing chicken wings with collard greens and rice, macaroni and cheese, jalapeno, bacon and cheddar, has generated a flock of fans. They also appeared on the Steve Harvey Show earlier this year.

Chef Forrest Parker leads the culinary team at the Old Village Post House Inn in Mt. Pleasant. From Opryland to the Lowcountry, the South Carolina native Parker joined the Hall Management Group team of acclaimed chefs in 2012. Charleston-educated and trained, Parker includes Southern ingredients and elements in his cooking throughout his career.

Chef Orchid Paulmeier was a contestant in the seventh season of the hit show, "The Next Food Network Star." She opened One Hot Mama's on Hilton Head Island in 2007. Blending time-tested Southern favorites like collards, cornbread and slow-cooked barbecue and ribs with her own homespun recipes, One Hot Mama's serves up "comfort food with a kick."

Throughout the year, the chef ambassadors will participate in a number of culinary and tourism events across the Southeast. They will conduct educational cooking seminars and discuss the culinary traditions from their respective parts of the state.

Museum, Farmers Market Get Top Tourism Award

The Colleton Museum and Farmers Market in Walterboro is the winner of the Charles A. Bundy Award, South Carolina's top award for rural tourism. Gov. Nikki Haley made the announcement at the annual Governor's Conference on Tourism & Travel at the Belmond Charleston Place in Charleston recently.

About five years ago, the community moved its treasured museum into a renovated 1950s grocery store in the downtown area and added a farmers market in the attached pavilion. What transpired was a unique blend of culture and agriculture that illustrated this small town's authentic appeal and enhanced the visitor experience.

The museum continued to promote Colleton's heritage, and the farmers market provided retail space for up to 50 local farmers who brought fresh fruits, vegetables, flowers and plants for sale.

In its former location, the Colleton Museum welcomed 4,908 visitors, most of whom were local. Visitation has steadily climbed since the museum was moved to its new location, and in 2015, the museum and farmers market saw 18,350 visitors. Special programming and events continue to draw visitors.

The Governor's Conference on Tourism & Travel is held every winter as an opportunity for industry leaders to network and leverage opportunities to grow tourism, which is a \$19 billion industry in South Carolina.

Sowing Seeds of Hope

We have two months of winter behind us, and, according to the famous weather prognosticator, Punxsutawney Phil, spring is right around the corner. This time of year, just before the peach trees show their first buds, is when hope springs eternal. For farmers, spring means sowing the seeds of faith for a prosperous crop, and this year, for many, it means trying to put the pieces back together after their fields were drowned in the rains last fall.

Since October, the South Carolina Department of Agriculture has worked hand in hand with others, primarily the South Carolina Farm Bureau, Clemson, and USDA, to try to secure financial aid for those affected by the thousand-year flood. While slow, progress has been made. But, as with most things in all forms of government, this is a process that will require patience from all of us.

At the end of January, SC Farm Bureau President Harry Ott and I met with Governor Nikki Haley to discuss flood relief for the agricultural industry. Our meeting was productive and the Governor committed to considering a proposal to secure aid for farmers, pending the availability of federal funding. While not a steadfast guarantee, the results of this meeting are a positive step toward recovery.

If South Carolina receives federal aid, the money will be administered as a grants and loans program through the US Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD). Working with our allied agricultural partners, we will form a team to carry out the program. SCDA has reached out to other states who managed similar programs to serve as models for what one might look like here. Should all the stars align, farmers could start to see aid from this program by late fall. This is a more time-consuming process, compared to previous disaster relief programs.

A few weeks ago, H4717 Palmetto Farm Aid Bill passed out of the House Ways and Means Committee with strong support and is headed to the House floor for vote as soon as possible this month. Ways and Means Committee Chair Brian White and the other co-sponsors drafted this bill to provide flood relief funding on the state level. In the bill's current form, eligible farmers must demonstrate at least a 40 percent total crop loss, and funding is capped at \$100,000 per farmer. If the bill is written into law, farmers could see grant monies by this summer.

The flood relief initiative organized by Advocates for Agriculture is moving along. The application deadline for *Plant it Forward SC* was Jan. 31, and the process of reviewing the applications has begun. A team will evaluate each one to determine eligibility. The goal is to start the distribution of funds by the end of March.

Staff at SCDA continue to work hard with other organizations to make sure the needs of South Carolina farmers are heard. Sometimes it's difficult to stay focused on the future in the midst of hardship, but much like planting a new crop, there has been a lot of work done and now we must wait to see the fruits of our labors.

Seedlings Still Available for Winter Planting

The SC Forestry Commission is encouraging landowners to place their orders while tree seedlings are still available. The seedling program provides a diverse selection of genetically improved seedlings for timber and Christmas tree production as well as wildlife and wetland habitat improvements.

Buyers have access to 15 popular trees grown and sold at the agency's Taylor Nursery in Edgefield County. The remaining stock includes containerized and bare-root varieties of longleaf pine and hardwood selections like sawtooth oak, Southern and Northern red oak and yellow poplar. Also, several Christmas tree selections, including containerized Leyland, Murray and Clemson Greenspire cypress and bare-root Virginia pine, are available.

Landowners Can Accept Interns for Forestry/Wildlife

Are you a landowner or manager who has experience that helps you manage your forest and wildlife? Do you need some assistance this summer with a few projects? If you answered "yes" to these questions, then consider offering an internship opportunity to a college student studying forestry or wildlife management.

Horry Georgetown Technical College requires 400 hours of intern experience. Ideally these hours are in the summer between the student's first and second year of college.

How much are interns paid? The salary is between land owner and student, but usually around \$10/hour.

What if the land is not in Horry or Georgetown County? Students come from all over the state and even out of state so someone is likely to be available. If housing is provided, even more students will be interested.

When can students start? Students usually are available to begin work in May.

What is required of the student and the employer during the internship? Landowners should pass on as much knowledge as possible. The Forestry/Wildlife faculty at Horry Georgetown Technical conducts two on-site visits. The student is required to submit weekly reports to the faculty.
