Sheep Shearing, Border Collies Featured at Old McCaskill's Farm Day on April 10

REMBERT--Dorset sheep and border collies will take center stage at Old McCaskill's Farm Day on April 10, where the yearly sheep shearing has become a full day of fun for the

Owners Lee and Cathy McCaskill have lived

on their Kershaw County farm since 1989, enamored with a lifestyle they call "hectic but rewarding." Their entire farm is devoted to sustainable living, and among their animals are the 30 or so Dorset sheep they raise for meat and for wool.

People have always been fascinated by their sheep, especially the shearing, Mrs. McCaskill said. In 2008, they hit upon the idea of inviting the public to watch the sheep being shorn. Originally called "A Day in the Life..." the spring event now focuses on the annual sheep

Professional shearer Chuck Coustner of Simple Time Farms in Kings Mountain will

clip the wool from about 30 sheep at the annual Sheep Shearing Day. An average fleece weighs five to 10 pounds, depending on the size of the animal. The wool is sent to Prince Edward Island in Canada, where it is washed, carded, dyed and spun into yarn.

The yarn is then made into blankets, which are sent back to Old McCaskill Farm to be sold in the store.

The second big draw at the farm day is a border

collie demonstration, where these talented dogs herd farm animals, including sheep and ducks. Professional dog handler Carol Anne Bailey of Red Creek Farm in Townville will bring a group of dogs to demonstrate how they

Other attractions for the day include a working blacksmith, Kershaw County Master oldmccaskillsfarm@gmail.com.

Gardeners, soap making, chair caning, the grist mill, saw mill and farm fresh concessions. Admission is \$5 per person, and children under 2 get in free.

Although the farm started as a hobby, it now has everything to sustain itself, Mrs. McCaskill said. For meat, they raise cattle, goats, sheep, pigs and chickens. The family grows their own vegetables, which they sell at their farm store and at local farmers' markets.

The McCaskills grind their own corn, and their bee hives produce enough honey for them to sell. They make goat cheese, butter, ice cream, and syrup, in addition to selling fresh meat. All the meats and sausages are preservative-free.

Visitors are welcome to tour the farm on Thursday, Friday, and Saturday afternoons. "There's always something going on, from daily chores to feeding animals to preparing meals," Mrs. McCaskill

Their on-site store showcases their farm-raised meat, produce, and hand-made items. The edibles at the store include lamb, pork, beef, goat, chickens, eggs, goat cheese, butter, honey, grits and milk, with a variety of Ashley's take-and-bake

On Fridays, the public can eat fresh home-cooked meals at their daughter Ashley's farm-to-table lunch, beginning at noon.

"A Day in the Life" starts at 1 p.m. Sunday, April 10, with the sheep shearing commencing around 1:30 p.m. Plenty of farm-fresh food, including samples of goat and lamb meat, will be available, with live bluegrass music as background. The farm is located at 377 Cantey Lane,

With 47 cook teams from across the Southeast, there was something to satisfy everyone's craving for savory, saucy pork. The weather was beautiful, in spite of the forecasted rain, and the crowd of around 3,000 was enthusiastic. Like the others, I enjoyed live music from the Going Commando Band and the antique tractor parade. Even the Easter Bunny was on hand to visit with the children in attendance.

The South Carolina Pork Board provided the meat for the event, along with IGA and Carolina Pride. Pit masters slow cooked nearly two tons of Boston butts this year. Other generous sponsorships from South Carolina Farm Bureau, US Foods, VB Hook and Senn Brothers helped make this event possible.

The trophies were a unique creation made from farm implements donated by AgriSupply in Florence. Colt Shirley, a local Camden artisan, designed one-of-a-kind awards blending BBQ and agriculture into highly sought after masterpieces.
