Homegrown Cotton

All-Natural Shirts Are Made in South Carolina

KINGSTREE--Atwood "At" McIntosh just wanted to find a good quality, all-cotton polo shirt that was made in the U.S.A. As a cotton farmer, he wanted to see the end product of his crop. Plus, he liked wearing cotton.

How hard could it be to make cotton shirts?

After asking questions, talking with textile mills, spinning and dying plants, clothing manufacturers, and retailers, he got his answer: nobody wanted to manufacture 100 percent local cotton shirts. Most textile plants in the Carolinas shut down decades ago. Manufacturers sent their products overseas to take advantage of cheap foreign labor.

Since he couldn't find a cotton shirt he'd be proud to wear, At decided to make his own. He had plenty of cotton on a 1,000 – acre farm in Williamsburg County, and a degree in business from Francis Marion University. After a year of intense research, he launched Homegrown Cotton shirts last July.

The shirts are made with 100 percent cotton straight from his farm. At likes to tell people that the shirts are grown and sewn in the Carolinas. "From our farm to your home, your polo can be traced back to the field it was grown in."

A 150-acre irrigated field is dedicated to producing the cotton fiber for the shirts. The cotton is ginned in nearby Salters, then the lint goes to Thomasville, N.C. to be spun. The yarn is knitted in Jefferson, then sent back across the border to Lincolnton for dying. The shirts are cut, sewn, and embroidered at Craig Industries in Lamar.

You won't find a storefront or a fancy shop at McIntosh Farms. In fact, you won't find a shop at all. The shirts are stored in a warehouse and shipped as needed to customers who buy from the website and to select retailers.

While At has done an exceptional job of producing cotton shirts, he's quick to tell you he's not a retailer. He's a farmer. In fact, he's an eighth generation cotton farmer. His family started growing cotton in Clarendon County decades ago. At was named for his great-grandfather, the first Atwood McIntosh.

"I started farming when I was about 6 years old, riding along with my dad. Now that he has stepped down, I manage the whole farm." The McIntoshes also grow peanuts and corn in Williamsburg County.

At recently bought a farm of his own just down the road from his parents and grandparents. The old home place has a rambling Victorian farmhouse built in the 1890s, which At wants to restore when he has time. Several original barns and other outbuildings are still in use. The wide L-shaped porches on the front and back of the house beckon folks to sit, relax, and enjoy life.

Right now, the enterprising young farmer doesn't have much time to relax. He farms in the daytime and devotes his evenings to his shirts. Sales are steady, but he'd like for Homegrown Cotton to become a major brand in South Carolina.

As well it should. Not only are the Homegrown Cotton shirts made of high quality, South Carolina cotton, the dyes are also all-natural and environmentally friendly. One of the shirts--called The Natural--has no dye at all; it's the off-white color of raw cotton.

Pump Up Your Summer

Although the calendar points to June 21, we all know that Memorial Day marks the official beginning of summer and also the beginning of the summer travel season. The Consumer Protection Division at SCDA works hard year round inspecting gas pumps, scales and ensuring food safety and other activities. So, the start of summer is a good time for you to ride along as we show you how we "Pump Up Your Summer!"

Consumer Services, which is an important branch of the Consumer Protection Division, ensures consumers get quality products in the quantity they purchase. Our twenty-three consumer services inspectors check the accuracy of weighing and measuring devices such as scales, gasoline dispensers, fuel oil meters, and LP gas meters, as well as the net content of packaged foods. You have probably seen them from time to time while filling up with gas; the Department sticker lets you know they've been there for you.

Each year, our inspectors test more than 65,000 gas pumps for accuracy. The department strives to perform a routine inspection on all pumps annually and will visit a station more often if a problem is reported or suspected. During an inspection, fuel is sent to our petroleum lab for analysis. If you see an inspection sticker on a pump that is over a year old, call the number on the sticker and let us know.

2 cloves garlic, crushed
2 teaspoons parsley, chopped
2 teaspoons chives, chopped

1/2 teaspoon pepper
1/2 cup flour
1 egg, beaten with 1 teaspoon water
1/2 cup bread crumbs, fine
2 tablespoons vegetable oil

Between two pieces of plastic wrap, pound each butterflied chop to 1/8-inch thickness. In the center of each, place 1 teaspoon cold butter and sprinkle with seasonings, distributing evenly over chops. Fold in two

opposite sides and roll up. Dredge each roll in flour, dip in egg wash, and roll in bread crumbs. Cover and chill 2-12 hours. Heat oil in heavy skillet, cook pork rolls 12-15 minutes, turning carefully to brown all sides. Serves 4.

All samples are tested for traces of water and sediment, octane rating, and the presence of ethanol. Kerosene, diesel and home heating oils are tested for flashpoint and sulfur content. Finally, diesel is tested for biodiesel content. Products containing 5 to 20 percent biodiesel must be labeled.

In addition to helping protect you at the pump, our Weights and Measures inspectors also check more than 18,500 scales around South Carolina. These include large scales at recycle centers, stockyards and truck stops, as well as smaller grocery store scales. When you purchase Certified SC Grown produce or meat packaged on-site in a grocery store, it has been weighed by one of our inspected scales.

If ever you feel you've received bad fuel or

had a problem at the pump, contact SCDA at 803-737-9690. It's helpful if you can identify the type and grade of product purchased, along with the pump number from which the fuel was dispensed. You can assist in this process by contacting us as soon as possible so that we can send an inspector to collect a sample for lab analysis while the product is still available.

Precautions on Roundup Ready 2 Xtend Soybeans

Roundup Ready 2 Xtend soybean varieties are now commercially available for planting in 2016. These soybeans offer over-the-top tolerance to both dicamba and glyphosate herbicides. However, dicamba herbicide (any formulation currently on the market) cannot be legally sprayed in Xtend soybean (or XtendFlex cotton).

According to Mike Marshall, Extension Weed Specialist at Clemson University, federal and state regulatory officials are closely monitoring these technologies (Enlist and Xtend) for any slip-ups, such as finding illegal residues of dicamba in these crops at the time of harvest.

Misuse of this technology could further delay or hamper development of new herbicide-tolerant technology in the U.S. In addition, Roundup Ready 2 Xtend soybeans have not yet received all key export partner approvals.

"This means Xtend soybeans will have to be segregated after harvest to prevent contamination of legally approved soybeans in the grain channel if full approval is not obtained by the end of the season," Marshall said.

Growers are advised to consider the additional cost of cleaning their harvest machinery, grain carts and trucks, and storage facilities before planting these soybeans.

Creating Healthier Communities Through Food Banks

The Healthy Small Retail and Food Bank Collaborative is launching a program called Farm to Food Bank. The pilot program will focus on increasing the distribution of fresh, frozen or canned fruits and vegetables at food banks and pantries in an effort to improve the health of South Carolinians.

Currently Golden Harvest Food Bank, Harvest Hope Food Bank, Second Harvest Food Bank of Metrolina and 11 associated food pantries in Allendale, Bamberg, Florence, Richland, Spartanburg and Union counties are participating. The Farm to Food Bank will eventually expand to include food pantries in Calhoun, Cherokee, Chester, Dillon, Fairfield, Kershaw, Lee, Marion and Orangeburg counties.

As part of the Farm to Food Bank program, the SC Department of Agriculture and the SC Department of Health and Environmental Control will be providing supplies, nutritional information and technical assistance. This initiative is part of a grant from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention to promote health and control chronic diseases and risk factors that are linked to obesity.

Being a small manufacturer brings many challenges. Right now, men's shirts are the only style made by Homegrown Cotton. Since women buy more shirts than men, it would seem feasible to make women's shirts. But manufacturing is complicated.

Adding a different style, with many different sizes and colors, is a huge step. "You can't order a few dozen of this or that; you have to order hundreds of the same shirt," At explained. "Right now I'm trying to get these shirts in more stores and make people aware that they can buy a good quality, all natural product made right here in South Carolina."

Homegrown Cotton shirts are available at about a dozen retailers, which are listed on the website, www.homegrowncotton.com. Customers can also order directly from the website.
