Midlands Farm Tour: Local farms, local flavor, local fun!

From strawberries to honey, and heirlooms to heritage hogs, this year's Midlands Farm Tour has local variety at its best. The Midlands Food Alliance invites the public to meet local farmers

on their farms FARM TOUR

and learn about the importance of supporting them. The food alliance is a group of farmers. chefs, and eaters who care about local food production. The 2016

Midlands Farm Tour will be held Saturday, May 21 from 11 a.m. until 6 p.m. The tour is a self-guided event. At each farm, tour-goers can meet the farmers and staff, their families, tour the property, explore what is harvested, and ask questions.

Participants are encouraged to sign the Local Food Pledge at any farm stop, committing to spend \$10 weekly on SC-grown products. Most



farms will have goods for sale and a variety of items sample.

A Midlands Farm to Fork Restaurant Feast will be May 13-21, leading up to the Midlands Farm Tour. Selected restaurants will serve

special menu items from farms on the tour, with an emphasis on local flavor.

Included on the tour are Six Berry Farm, Mercer House Estate Winery, USC Community Farm Garden, Patchwork

Farms, Terra Kotta Farm, Bee Trail Farm, Wright Farm of SC, the State Farmers Market, Sandhills Heirlooms, and Humble Farms

The farmers will be busy conducting tours, so volunteers are needed at every farm to check in guests, sell passes, and act as friendly ambassadors. Volunteers will be invited to the Farmer Potluck on May 12 at Mercer House Estate Winery.

This farm tour is more than an event -- it's an opportunity to sow the seeds for positive social and economic change. If every resident purchased \$5 of food each week directly from a farmer, the impact would be about \$1.2 billion

Ticket prices are \$15, which includes all farms on the tour. Children under 10, WIC, SNAP and EBT beneficiaries and families are admitted free of charge. Early-bird tickets for \$10 are available until May 20. Purchase tickets or sign up to volunteer at www.MidlandsFarmTour.com.

3 1/2 pound boneless blade pork roast 3 T unsalted butter

1/3 cup onion, diced

1 cup ketchup

1/2 cup water

In a medium saucepan over medium heat. melt the butter. Add the onion and cook, stirring occasionally, until translucent, about 5 minutes. Add the ketchup, water, lemon juice, brown sugar, mustard, Worcestershire sauce and salt and bring to a boil over high heat. Reduce to a simmer and cook for 10 minutes. Crop Outlooks Are Optimistic

2015 brought devastation for the state's row crop farmers. Now that it's planting season, cotton and soybean farmers are hoping for a better year.

About 80 percent of South Carolina's cotton is planted the first week of May. Some growers plant a little earlier or later, depending on what other crops they might have in their rotation. For instance, farmers who are also growing peanuts might plant their cotton a couple of weeks later so that they will have time to get the peanuts in first.

Cotton growers hope for a mild, moist spring followed by a summer averaging 3 to 5 inches of rain a month. When it comes to heat and drought, cotton is one of the most tolerant crops, but temperatures persistently above 95 degrees and/or weeks without rain can damage quality and quantity.

"Clemson has a strong research team working with cotton," said Michael Jones, associate professor and cotton specialist at Clemson University's Pee Dee Research and Education Center. "Most of what I do here at Pee Dee is variety testing. Most of the varieties that are released to our growers come from Texas and even the far West. Our team has to determine which of these varieties are best able to withstand the environmental conditions in South Carolina."

Cotton farmers are hoping for a fresh start – and maybe a healthy dose of luck – in 2016. "We can still produce a great crop this year. It just depends on our weather," Jones said. "South Carolina has the technology and willpower to grow the best cotton out there. Growers just need a few things to go their way this time around."

What's in store for soybean growers in 2016?

Soybeans are usually planted between the middle of May and the middle of June, according to Benjamin Fallen, a renowned soybean breeder at Clemson University's Pee Dee Research and Education Center.

The timing of rain is more critical than intensity. If growers plant their seeds when it's too dry, the seeds won't begin to develop, but with a little rain, they will grow into large, hardy plants.

"There's a relatively short window between the time you plant the beans and the time they germinate," Fallen said. "If it's real hot during the spring, they'll just sit in the ground and bake. You either need to have good moisture already in the ground, or a little rain from the skies to prompt them to germinate."

Once the heat of summer arrives, farmers will be rooting for weekly rains that drop an inch or two at a time. This will keep the beans growing at a healthy pace.

"Three to five inches a week during the summer is about how much water the soil around here can store," Fallen said. "There is only a certain window of time within which soybeans grow vegetatively, and then you have a certain amount of time that they grow reproductively. All of this is crucial to the end product."

Fallen has been working feverishly over the past several years breeding soybean varieties acquired from around the world. His goal is to produce higher-yielding soybeans with improved composition that will make them better suited to be used as biofuels, more resistant to insects and disease, and more tolerant to drought.

"I've been focusing on building a breeding program that will produce 21st-century soybeans for South Carolina," said Fallen. His fingers are crossed that 2016 will be a rebound year for the soybean industry.
