Funding Period Now Open for South Carolina Farm Aid

Farmers who suffered crop loss due to last year's flooding can now apply for South Carolina Farm Aid grants from the South Carolina Department of Agriculture. The deadline for applying is August 15.

The S.C. General Assembly approved \$40 million in state aid to help farms in

The S.C. General Assembly approved \$40 million in state aid to help farms in flood-ravaged communities. Farmers can receive grants covering 20 percent of their crop loss up to \$100,000.

"The historic flood that hit South Carolina devastated many of the small farms across the rural areas of our state," said Commissioner Hugh Weathers. "While this won't make our farmers whole, we hope through this relief funding, they can begin to recover."

To be eligible for the grant, farmers must have:

 experienced a verifiable loss of affected agricultural commodities of at least 40 percent as a result of the October 2015 flooding, a farm located in a USDA disasterdeclared South Carolina county and

 a United Stated Department of Agriculture-FarmService Agency issued farm number.


Applicants will also be required to sign an affidavit, under penalty of perjury, certifying that loss information is accurate. Acceptable documentation of loss varies based on each crop.

"Agribusiness is South Carolina's largest industry and a major economic driver in our rural areas," said Rick Reames, Director of the S.C. Department of Revenue. "These grants will help ensure this industry's continued strength and generate new growth."

Whenever July rolls around I am reminiscent of a wonderful childhood growing up on a peach farm in South Carolina. My family has always been proud that my great-grandfather planted the first commercial peach orchard in Spartanburg County. And in the '70s, while doing payroll and accounts receivable for our harvest season, I had no idea that we weren't the most important farm in the world.

In July of 1974, our 10 truckloads a day seemed like enough peaches to supply every grocery store in America. I thought that, without my family, the rest of the world might not even know what a peach was! I say this to show how simple and sheltered life was growing up on a farm in South Carolina -- a few years ago.

Today the technology available to peach farmers amazes me. Two summers ago I toured Titan Farms. It was encouraging to find that the dreaded job of grading peaches, which made me so motion sick that I would actually pass out on the line, is now done electronically. Modern packing houses are state-of-the-art and clean as a whistle!

But in my day, everything in the peach shed was wet and nasty. People don't believe me when I tell them that to this day I can't stand the smell of peach scented anything.

From picking to packing to shipping, today's technology ensures the quality of peaches in your local grocery store as well as safety for those who work to put them there. As I look back on some childhood memories, I recall a day when my daddy and my Uncle Ben left me alone at the packing shed office. Someone arrived with an unexpected trailer load of peaches and no one was there to unload it. As a girl on the farm with two competitive brothers, I always wanted to prove myself. So, that day I decided to climb aboard the Bobcat, a machine similar to a forklift, and unload the trailer myself.

If you have ever driven a Bobcat you know that this simply is NOT POSSIBLE! Driving a Bobcat for the first time is like slow dancing with an octopus! In short order I had Hwy. 176 coming to a complete halt as I poured a half-ton of peaches right onto the middle of the road. There was no help in sight! It made me so mad that to this day I tell everyone that Daddy and Ben had snuck off to the golf course.

I am proud of my heritage in South Carolina agriculture, and I wish that we could reclaim some of the simplicity of those times in our lives. But I am even more proud to be associated with a modern industry that focuses on quality, quantity and safe practices for our environment and for our food source. And I am grateful that I don't have to dance with a Bobcat ever again!
