Thirty Days Remaining to Apply for South Carolina Farm Aid Funding

SOUTH CAROLINA (July 14, 2016) – Farmers who suffered crop loss due to last year's flood have thirty days remaining to apply for South Carolina Farm Aid grants through the South Carolina Department of Agriculture (SCDA). The deadline for applying is August 15, 2016.

To be eligible for the grant, farmers must have:

- experienced a verifiable loss of affected agricultural commodities of at least 40-percent as a result of the October 2015 flooding,
- a farm located in a USDA flood disaster declared South Carolina county and
- a United Stated Department of Agriculture-Farm Service Agency issued farm number.

Applicants will also be required to sign an affidavit, under penalty of perjury, certifying that loss information is accurate. Acceptable documentation of loss varies based on each crop.

"Along with our partners, we've hosted educational sessions throughout the state to help farmers with the application process," said Commissioner Hugh Weathers. "I encourage farmers who intend to apply to connect with local county agents for assistance in completing their application."
