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Turkeys Are Huge Business in SC

Like all other facets of agriculture, turkey production has made vast improvements in recent years. Gone are the large outdoor pens filled with turkeys exposed to the elements. Now, the birds all live indoors in huge houses specially constructed to keep them healthy. Light, heat and ventilation are as important as the scientifically formulated rations that help them grow efficiently. Nutritionists and veterinarians oversee their development from hatching to the processing plant.



Many steps are involved in raising turkeys. First is the hatchery, where the eggs are incubated for 28 days. After hatching, the poults are sent to a brooder farm that keeps the young birds for 5 to 6 weeks. Then the turkeys are sent to the growers, who keep them until they are ready for market at 19 to 20 weeks.

Turkeys are fed a balanced diet of corn and soybean meal supplemented with vitamins and minerals. The hens and the toms grow at different rates, with the toms maturing at 40 pounds while the hens top out at 15 or so pounds at 12 weeks. The hens are mostly sold as whole birds, and the toms are sent for further processing. On average, it takes nearly 100 pounds of feed to raise a tom turkey to market weight.

The state's biggest turkey companies are Prestage Farms in Cassett and Circle S Ranch, based in Monroe, N.C. Prestage has 122 different farms with a total of 578 turkey houses in South Carolina. Circle S has about 70 growers in South Carolina, mostly in the Upstate.

Jimmie Lee Shaw, the farm manager for Overbridge Farms in Newberry, said they receive 29,000 young tom turkeys at a time from Circle S Ranch. "We're contract growers, which means we provide the buildings, labor, and facilities," he said. "We're paid based on efficiency. Feed conversion determines how big a bird we can grow."

Overbridge Farms' birds are ultimately used as processed meat, rather than ending up on someone's Thanksgiving table. Circle S grows about 3 million birds for Kraft and another 4 to 4.5 million for Cargill in Virginia.

Prestage and Circle S are known as integrators, meaning they own the birds, deliver the feed, and pick up and deliver the turkeys. The grower owns the land and the houses and provides the labor.

With one of the world's largest single-stage turkey poult hatching facilities, Prestage can set up to 650,000 eggs per week. All the eggs are placed in the incubators on the same day, and they hatch at the same time. The poults are separated by sex when they hatch.

"We grow the toms in South Carolina, and the hens in North Carolina," said Dr. Ron Prestage, the president of the company. Prestage Farms is a family owned business. His dad started the farm in 1994 and the company has grown steadily. It now can produce 7 million toms a year, all of which are sold to KraftHeinz in Newberry.

The South Carolina poultry industry represents 40 percent of all agriculture in the state. Sales are \$1.5 billion per year.

The Votes Are In

The dust is settling around the 2016 Presidential Election, the ink is drying in the history books. Donald Trump, the 45th President-Elect, faces the task of navigating the country into the next four years, and Americans should come together to move our country ahead.

Elections bring serious implications for agriculturalists as our political leaders write policy that affects farmers directly in their pocketbook. As we move forward with Mr. Trump at the helm, there are some key issues that farmers will be closely watching.

The rural voice was heard loud and clear in this election. Farmers nationwide overwhelmingly favored Trump over Clinton, 55 percent to 18 percent, according to a survey conducted by Agri-Pulse last month. More than 70 percent said that regulatory policies were on the wrong track, and 86 percent said they were "somewhat" or "very dissatisfied" with the way things are going in the country.

Mr. Trump has vowed to cut often burdensome regulations like the Waters of the US rules and will likely target pesticide and labor regulations as well. That will be a welcome change for South Carolina farmers.

Uncertainty still looms around what happens to trade and immigration policy. The future of the 12-nation Trans-Pacific Partnership looks doubtful. Mr. Trump made opposition to the TPP a major focus of his campaign and he pledged to renegotiate the North American Free Trade Agreement (NAFTA). NAFTA has been a major benefit to U.S. agricultural exports for the last 20 years, so agriculture will need to be engaged in any discussion on its future. During the campaign, Mr. Trump spoke about tariffs on China, a major market for U.S. soybeans and other farm products. All of these require delicate balance and agriculture must be at the forefront.

One thing is for certain: immigration reform will get a lot of attention, and reform will require a balanced approach. The current guest-worker program is difficult to navigate and very burdensome on farmers in need of a stable workforce.

A survey conducted by the National Council of Agricultural Employers shows under the current system, administrative delays result in workers arriving an average of 22 days after the date of need. That means farmers can be left without a way to get their crops out of the field in a timely way. Mr. Trump's advisors say he will streamline the current H-2A visa program to make it easier for farmers to import the labor they need. That's certainly a positive stance.

America is a great land of independently thinking people, less than 2 percent of whom have chosen production agriculture as their profession. The future is always uncertain and change is inevitable; however, with a balanced viewpoint, our political leaders can write sound policies that will continue to ensure farmers' freedom to operate. I am confident that Mr. Trump will recognize that agriculture is vital to the future security of our country, and I also pledge to continue to be a voice for South Carolina farmers both here at home and in Washington, D.C.
