FFA Teams Showcase Tractor Driving Skills

FFA students from all over the state converged on the Florence Civic Center last week to test their tractor skills. The Career

Development Event--one of more than 20 held each year--is an FFA competition in which teams of four are judged on their ability to drive a tractor through an obstacle course. To make it more difficult, the tractor tows a flatbed trailer.

The youth had to negotiate a tight course of cones, then return to the starting point and back their rig into place. The event was timed, and penalties were assessed for errors, such as touching a cone or knocking one over. Other penalties were given for technical errors, such as grinding gears or spinning the tires.

Two teams competed simultaneously, starting at 10-minute intervals all day on Wednesday. In addition to the competition, the young people were exposed to the latest in technology from various vendors and had the opportunity to attend a leadership seminar with workshops led by the SC State FFA officers.

Judges were Jonathan Croft and Cody Bishop, both of whom are Clemson Extension agents based in Orangeburg County. As each student started, the judge allowed time to become familiar with the new Kubota L2501.

"The tractor we use is old, and the gears and brakes are worn," explained Travis Ard, the ag teacher at Edisto High School. "On a new tractor, the gears are different and it's much more sensitive."

Judging and scoring the 45 teams took all day, with a brief lunch break. While the majority of students are boys, there were a few girls competing. Nationally, females comprise about 40 percent of FFA students, Ard said.

Most of the students watched carefully as other teams drove the course. That helped them learn the layout and see which turns might prove more difficult. Occasionally a tire brushed against a cone but for the most part, the young people exhibited excellent driving skills. Many of them looked like old hands, making tight turns at speed and then backing the trailer into a narrow slot.

Making the competition run smoothly was score keeper Regina Fitzpatrick, the program assistant for FFA. With the top scores having only fractions of a second between them, the time was crucial.

The top team was Ashley Ridge High School from Summerville. In second place was Belton-Honea Path High School, followed by Gilbert High School in third place.

The three high scoring individuals were Pierce Latham of Ashley Ridge with the top score, Russ Hutto from Branchville in second, and Austin Culpepper of Honea Path finishing third.

New Market Bulletin Policy on Dogs, Land, Livestock

property. No agents, no dealers, no second party ads can be accepted. Submission by anyone other than the owner is a violation of federal law.

LIVESTOCK WANTED

The Market Bulletin will no longer run ads seeking "unwanted, free animals." Instead, the ads must be specific in nature, such as:

Wanted: freshening dairy goat, any breed, to join small milking herd.

Wanted: well trained gaited trail horse suitable for novice rider. Gelding preferred.

Wanted: Trio of black-shouldered or India blue peafowl.

Wanted: Black Angus or Angus cross heifers.

Plowing a Little Deeper

Agriculture has come a long way from the days of mule and plow. And while we may reminisce about "the good ol' days," the fact remains that we have certainly learned how to farm smarter instead of harder. Thanks to advancements in technology, yields are up while farmers' environmental impact is down, two important components of a more sustainable agriculture.

One of the first things that comes to mind when you mention technology and agriculture in the same sentence is biotechnology, more specifically: genetically modified organisms or GMOs. Genetic modification is a plant breeding technique that takes a specific trait from one plant and uses it in another plant for a specific purpose. I think it's important for readers of this column to plow a little deeper into GMOs to be truly informed.

Genetic modification of plants has been taking place for as long as people have been growing crops for food. A big leap took place more than 30 years ago when the first commercial GMO seeds became available.

Today's computer-aided techniques are more precise, and more regulated, than any other method. No other type of new seed that comes to market from other breeding methods goes through regulatory approval - only GMOs are required to be reviewed. The review process takes about 13 years and costs an average of \$136 million.

One of the main benefits of using seeds improved through biotechnology comes in the form of preserving natural resources. Plants can better withstand drought and certain pests, which means they need less water and fewer chemicals all while achieving higher yields.

With the proliferation of challenges to GMOs, the question could be asked: "What would happen if they were banned altogether?" Well, a recent study conducted by Purdue University shows that a global ban on genetically modified crops would raise food prices and add the equivalent of nearly a billion tons of carbon dioxide to the atmosphere. A ban on GMOs would also trigger the conversion of pastures and forests to cropland to compensate for conventional crops' lower productivity, releasing substantial amounts of stored carbon to the atmosphere.

Crops improved through biotechnology are a point of contention for many, even though more than 2,000 independent studies all agree that they are safe for us to eat. Another important distinction in the biotech discussion is that a GMO isn't an ingredient; it's simply a breeding technique. And while some would have you believe that "GMOs are in everything," there are only eight GMO crops commercially available in the United States: corn, squash, soybeans, alfalfa, cotton, sugar beets, papaya and canola.

By the year 2050, the world population will reach 9 billion. That's a lot of neighbors. And farmers will have to grow more food on less land to feed all of them. Crops improved through biotechnology are an important tool in a farmer's toolbox; however, farmers must continue to be resourceful stewards to sustain their operations while constantly exploring new cultural practices.

Waste Pesticide Collection Coming to Kingstree

The South Carolina Department of Agriculture is offering South Carolina residents the opportunity to safely dispose of outdated, unusable or unwanted pesticides.

The pesticide and chemical program is open to all private, commercial and non-commercial pesticide applicators in the state, as well as homeowners. SCDA staff will be on site to monitor pesticide collection and disposal, and will have final authority on acceptance of products.

- Chemical and pesticide quantities accepted will be limited to 2500 pounds of solid and 300 gallons of liquid at no charge.
- Pesticide products accepted include herbicides, insecticides, nematicides, fungicides and similar products used in agricultural production or around the home.
- Rinsate will not be accepted.
- Fertilizer will not be accepted unless it is combined or co-packed with a pesticide such as weed and feed.
- No compressed gas cylinders (metal cylinder with a valve) or empty pesticide containers will be collected.

The collection is scheduled for January 25 from 9 a.m. – 3 p.m. at Crop Protection Services located at 1861 Eastland Avenue, Kingstree, SC 29556.

Easy Beef Tostadas

1 lb ground beef
1 cup chopped red bell pepper
1/2 cup chili sauce
1 teaspoon taco seasoning
Kosher salt
Freshly ground black pepper
6 tostada shells
3 cups shredded lettuce
1 cup guacamole
1-1/2 cups shredded Mexican cheeses
Salsa
Sliced pickled jalapeños
Black olives
Chopped green onion (optional)
Chopped cilantro (optional)

In a large skillet over medium heat, cook beef and red pepper until meat is no longer pink. Drain, and stir in chili sauce, taco seasoning, salt and pepper; heat thoroughly.

Layer each tostada with lettuce, meat mixture, guacamole, cheese, salsa, jalapeños and black olives. Top with chopped green onion and cilantro, if desired.
