Taste of SC Features New Chef Ambassadors

FLORENCE--The four new Chef Ambassadors will be a star attraction at the SC Agribiz and Farm Expo on Jan. 11 and 12. Named to their posts in December, these select chefs embody the best of South Carolina's food scene, both in their menus and their flair in using local ingredients. Each chef will have his own food station at The Taste of South Carolina, a signature event slated for Wednesday evening. Guests at the popular \$25-per-ticket featured event will experience a variety of unique dishes.

The chefs are William Cribb of Spartanburg, Amy Fortes of Fort Mill, Adam Kirby of Pawleys Island, and Sean Mendes of Charleston.

Chef Cribb is the executive chef of two popular establishments in Spartanburg: Cribbs Kitchen, the 2016 Small Business of the Year in Spartanburg, and Willy Taco. He also owns Cribbs Catering. Having spent years in Colorado and North Carolina honing his culinary skills, Chef Cribb strives to always incorporate fresh, flavorful, seasonal and sustainable fare into his menus.

While taking a break from the study of medicine, Chef Fortes worked at several restaurants in her hometown of Lockport, New York. She changed her major and went into the

restaurant business. Now the co-owner and chef of The Flipside Restaurant, The Flipside Café and The Flipside Catering Company in Rock Hill and Fort Mill, she thrives on the relationships between great food and great people.

A graduate from Le Cordon Bleu of the Western Culinary Institute, Chef Kirby is the co-owner of Bistro 217 on Pawleys Island – an establishment he's been with since it opened in 2004. Pulling inspiration from both his Southern roots and his time spent in Hawaii and the west coast, Chef Kirby's regularly changing menu incorporates locally sourced elements, with an emphasis on fresh seafood.

Chef Mendes was exposed at an early age to distinctive cuisines from all over the world. Authentic and unique culinary experiences were part of his life. In 2012 Chef Mendes opened the wildly popular food truck, Roadside Seafood in Charleston. Later he opened a full-fledged restaurant under the same name. When he decided to venture into the gourmet burger world, he opened Blues Burger Joint in Charleston, a go-to place for "top shelf" burgers.

The South Carolina Chef Ambassador program began in 2014 to highlight and showcase the culinary offerings and tourism destinations found throughout the state of South Carolina. The program is a joint initiative between the South Carolina Department of Agriculture and the South Carolina Department of Parks, Recreation & Tourism.

Some of the other highlights include FFA's Statewide Tractor Operations and Safety CDE Contest, the Small Farmer Symposium, and Youth Day. Marketing crops and cattle, spray technologies, cover crops, the Food Safety Modernization Act, and hay fertilization are a few of the topics offered.
