## Certified South Carolina Celebrates 10 Years

One of the SC Department of Agriculture's most popular programs, Certified South Carolina, is celebrating a successful decade. Introduced in May 2007, Certified SC is a cooperative effort among producers, processors, wholesalers, retailers, restaurants, food service distributors, specialty food producers and the SC Department of Agriculture.

The purpose of the program is to increase sales for the state's farmers through a branding campaign that easily identifies South Carolina products, encourages consumers to buy locally, and creates easier distribution of locally grown products.

More than 2,000 members participate in the branding program, which features distinctive Certified SC logos. The logos, which many people recognize on sight, identify South Carolina products. According to research, residents believe that SC produce is much higher quality than food from out of state.

Anyone who produces or manufactures agricultural products in South Carolina may apply to become part of the program, explained branding coordinator Ansley Turnblad.

CSC is supported by more than 500 retail outlets, including leading supermarket chains

and several out-of-state retailers. In addition, 200 Certified Roadside and agritourism markets and 100 Specialty Food companies are part of the program, which has experienced continuous growth since its inception.

"Demand for locally grown food has never been higher," commented SC Commissioner of Agriculture Hugh Weathers.

In 2009 the Fresh on the Menu program was introduced. It identifies restaurants that source at least 25 percent of their food locally. People are now searching out the Fresh on the Menu restaurants, Turnblad said.

"For a simple way to find the restaurants, download the free Fresh on the Menu app from the App Store or Google play."

The state's return on its investment in the Certified SC Program totaled approximately \$2.3 billion in 2013, the last year for which statistics are available. Included are meat animals, poultry and eggs, vegetables, fruits, nuts, peanuts, dairy, and horticulture. The numbers continue to grow.

"Some of the best calls I get come from other state departments of agriculture asking how they can emulate our success," Turnblad said.

### Links in the Food Chain

The American food system is recognized as one of the most advanced in the world. Moving food from farms to the grocery store certainly requires much planning and preparation. There are many links in the chain, from the grower to the final destination. Through the Certified SC Grown retail merchandising program, we have the chance to help facilitate that process while increasing marketing opportunities for South Carolina farmers.

Long before the seed ever goes in the ground, farmers start making a plan to sell their crops with the goal of successfully marketing their entire harvest. For example, early peach varieties are often smaller than the peaches most South Carolinians enjoy around the Fourth of July, but they are highly sought after by certain demographics in the Northeast. Farmers with early season peaches have found a niche market for fruit that might not be in high demand for a local market.

Our retail merchandising team specializes in helping farmers identify niche markets like these and cultivating inter-continental relationships with produce buyers. We have had success through Certified SC Grown, marketing South Carolina products to our neighbors to the north.

"Our butterbeans are sought out by Charleston chefs and have been featured at the James Beard House. As a result, we sell our butterbeans at a more competitive price point and plan to increase production." ~ Josh Johnson, Old Thyme Butter Bean Company.

2 tablespoons sugar  
1 teaspoon vanilla  
1/2 teaspoon salt  
3 tablespoons butter  
1/4 cup powdered sugar  
1 cup seasonal berries

Pour milk and next five ingredients in a blender and blend until smooth and frothy, about 2 minutes. Place blender container in refrigerator to chill for about 20 minutes. While batter is chilling, cut butter into

12 pieces; set aside.

Preheat oven to 425° and place a 12-cup muffin tin in oven until heated. Remove batter from refrigerator, then remove muffin tin from oven and place one piece of butter in each cup, swirling around to melt. Quickly pour batter into buttered muffin cups, filling each cup about 1/2 to 2/3 full. Place muffin tin in oven and bake 12-15 minutes or until edges are golden. Batter will rise substantially, then deflate quickly once removed from oven creating the perfect well for fresh berries. Remove tin from oven; dust cups with powdered sugar. Fill each cup with fresh seasonal berries as desired. Serve warm or at room temperature.

Also prior to planting season, we have meeting season. Many farmers use that time to nurture and grow their relationship with retailers and other outlets. Produce buyers or regional buyers from the retailers will make a game plan about where to purchase the produce for their store in the following season. Regional chains like IGA or the Southeastern Grocers source from farms closer to each store, while national brands like Wal-Mart move South Carolina produce as far west as Texas and even into Canada and Mexico. Some farms participate in direct store deliveries where the farm delivers to the store instead of to a distribution center. And some farms sell to wholesalers like the ones located at our State Farmers Market.

In addition to connecting farmers and retailers, the merchandising team helps farmers analyze market trends and look for opportunities to diversify. The hope is to ensure that farmers grow enough but not too much for the market. They hate having an abundant crop without a market to support it.

Our team also works with grocery stores to implement Certified SC Grown signage and other point of sale material to help consumers select and identify products grown by our farmers. We have averaged signage on more than 500 locations in the peak of summer harvest. Our staff also serves as an information hub during the growing season to help retailers forecast available volume and quality so they can make their sales promotion plans accordingly. With a tough year like this one for our peaches, this part of the job is especially challenging.

Our harvest season gets going mid to late May, and Certified SC Grown produce starts showing up in stores around the state. Farmers have honed the process of moving product from their farm to your table as quickly and efficiently as possible so that you enjoy the freshest, tastiest fruits and vegetables.

As always, I hope you'll look for and purchase Certified SC Grown where you shop and dine this summer. I also hope that you'll have a better understanding and appreciation for how it gets to your table.

### Easy Beef Tostadas

1 lb ground beef	1 cup guacamole
1 cup chopped red bell pepper	1-1/2 cups shredded Mexican cheeses
1/2 cup chili sauce	Salsa
1 teaspoon taco seasoning	Sliced pickled jalapeños
Kosher salt	Black olives
Freshly ground black pepper	Chopped green onion (optional)
6 tostada shells	Chopped cilantro (optional)
3 cups shredded lettuce	

In a large skillet over medium heat, cook beef and red pepper until meat is no longer pink. Drain, and stir in chili sauce, taco seasoning, salt and pepper; heat thoroughly.

Layer each tostada with lettuce, meat mixture, guacamole, cheese, salsa, jalapeños and black olives. Top with chopped green onion and cilantro, if desired. Serves 6.

## SC Department of Agriculture Prepares for Implementation of Industrial Hemp Pilot Program

Governor Henry McMaster signed Bill 3559 into law Thursday, May 11, making it legal for industrial hemp to be grown for research purposes in South Carolina, in accordance with the 2014 Farm Bill. The South Carolina Department of Agriculture will administer the application and permitting process.

The legislation allows for up to 20 farmers to receive permits to grow industrial hemp. The farmers who receive permits will each be allowed to grow up to 20 acres of the crop. Farmers selected will represent all growing areas of the state.

"The industrial hemp bill adds another opportunity for South Carolina farmers to increase crop diversity," said Hugh Weathers, South Carolina Commissioner of Agriculture. "SCDA is working closely with allied agencies and interested parties to ensure timely implementation of the law."

To qualify for a permit, the grower must:

- be a South Carolina resident,
- pass a state and federal background check administered by the South Carolina Law Enforcement Division,
- have a signed contract with an industrial hemp manufacturer/processor, and
- submit GPS coordinates for the land where the industrial hemp will be grown.

## Ag + Art Tour in June is Nation's Largest Free Farm & Art Tour

The 2017 South Carolina Ag + Art Tour has extended its reach, stretching across 11 counties and showcasing nearly 80 agricultural sites and 130 artisans.

This year's participating counties are Chester, Chesterfield, Darlington, Fairfield, Florence, Horry, Kershaw, Lancaster, Newberry, Union, and York. Tours will be held every weekend in June with different counties participating each weekend. Hours are Saturdays from 9 a.m. – 5 p.m., and 1 p.m. – 5 p.m. on Sundays.

 June 10 – 11: Chester County, York County  
 June 17 – 18: Kershaw County, Lancaster County  
 June 24 – 25: Fairfield County, Newberry County, Union County

Now in its sixth year, the tour is a great way to educate residents and visitors alike about where their food and fiber comes from, as well as introduce them to local artisans, says Ben Boyles, Clemson Extension Agribusiness Agent and Tour Administrator. The tour began in York County in 2012 as a way to blend agriculture and art and has grown each year. It is now the largest free farm and art tour in the nation.

Boyles said the growth and interest in the Ag + Art Tour has been phenomenal. "We are proud of how this tour has continued to expand," he said. "One of our goals has been to give people a better knowledge of what is produced in their own back yards, and this event puts food and product with a face."

With the addition of two new counties this year--Florence and Newberry-- visitors will have the opportunity to visit 80 agricultural sites and interact with more than 130 artisans. Tour stops include farms and farmers markets with art featured at each location. Artisans on the tour range from weavers, painters, musicians, storytellers, metalworkers and craftsmen, to poets and live musical performers.

Some of the farms will offer value-added products, such as jarred and canned foods, honey, baked goods or even farm-fresh meals. Visitors can start and stop their tour at any location they choose.

In addition to the tour, some counties will host kickoff events to introduce the featured farm sites and artisans to their communities.
