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# Agritourism puts fun in farming

# Adding hospitality & education brings additional income to ag

Having fun on the farm is perhaps the best way to describe agritourism. Bringing consumers and farmers together in a relaxed setting allows farmers to earn additional income while sharing lifestyles with non-farm families. People arm tun earn

food comes from, and they experience a variety of interesting activities.

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One of the rewards of farming is sh

One of the rewards of farming is sharing the satisfaction of producing food and other resources. Consumers are increasingly aware of food sources, the environment, healthy choices, how animals tie into the food chain, and how our next generation interacts with agriculture.

Agritourism meets all of these needs, and it adds a fun component for visitors to the special farms that are part of this program.

SCDA's Jackie Moore has been the state's agritourism director since 2014, when the program officially began in South Carolina. The SC Agritourism Association helps agritourism farms do a better job of marketing themselves and creating sustainable activities. It also helps people find the farms, which increases ag based tourism.

"When you have weather issues like we had the last three years, farmers have to find another source of income," Moore said. "We're trying to keep people on the farms."

Agritourism has grabbed the attention of young people. Moore explained that

she sees a good many of the younger generation taking over family farms, and they are embracing agritourism as a way to add income and to connect with c o n s u m e r s. Families also want their children to know more about food sources and the environment. The agritourism

association has 120 members across the state. To be an agritourism venue, the farm must have events, products or attractions that are open to the public. The farms include you-pick operations for fruits, berries and vegetables value-added products like jams, jarred sauces or farm-fresh milk or butter; farm-to-table dining; festivals or special events like sheep shearing or pumpkin smashing; and activities for children like tours, educational demonstrations or farm animals they can pet.

The president of the SC Agritourism ional Association for 2018 is Rebecca McArthur, the owner of McArthur Farms in Marlboro County. their She started the farm with 20 acres of fresh

produce specializing in strawberries. In 2007 she designed and built a market that includes a retail shop as well as a restaurant. The farm has grown to 180 acres, plus 250 acres of rented land, on which they grow fruits, berries 1vegetables, and row crops.

In addition to top quality fresh produce, the farm

offers a family friendly environment. The bakery and sweet shop sell homemade breads, fudge, cakes, cookies and pies, using local ingredients. The Strawberry Festival in May brings lots of visitors, and tours for school children include a wagon ride, an 18-acre Fun Park, and hands-on time in the fields.

Rebecca's motto which could serve for many agritourism venues is "We grow memories." She takes her new responsibility with the agritourism association seriously.

"My vision is to work with agritourism farms to develop association standards of safety for various activities on our farms, and to work closely with our legislature to seek support of being exempt from collecting admission taxes for agritourism operations," she said.

o add income and Other goals include providing an environment for people to develop their own unique means of celebrating agriculture and hosting a successful, record-breaking conference for 2019.

The SC Department of Agriculture has 335 farms on its agritourism list, with more coming on board weekly, according to the agritourism director.

But agritourism requires special people. "Not just any farmer can do this," Moore said, adding that the ag operator has to love people and have a passion for sharing his or her story. "They must want to have people come learn about their farms and where their food comes from."

# Precision Farming in the Netherlands

Would you believe me if I told you that the Netherlands – a country that's half the size of South Carolina – is the number two food exporter in the world, second only to the United States? Would you believe it if I told you that since 2000, farmers in the Netherlands have reduced the amount of water they use by 90 percent? One more -- that they've almost completely eliminated the use of pesticides on plants and reduced the use of antibiotics on livestock by 60 percent?

I recently joined others for a brief trip to the Netherlands, and as the old saying goes: seeing is believing. How do they do it? Controlled environment agriculture, or as some call it, precision farming indoors. Farmers in South Carolina are becoming accustomed to using precision farming methods, but not inside a 20-foot high greenhouse.

Growing produce in greenhouses with high-tech climate and light controls, farmers in the Netherlands create ideal conditions for tomatoes and other specialty crops. The sites I visited had anywhere from 20 to 200 acres of controlled environment facilities.

The Dutch are no strangers to greenhouses. During World War II, they were starving and knew they had to figure out how to grow food differently.

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God forbid we should ever face anything close to a world war again, but with the world's population expected to grow to 10 billion by 2050, global food supply is something we have to think about now. Farmers around the world will have to grow more food in the next 40 years than has ever been grown, period.

Does South Carolina have a role to play as the world's population grows and faces a potential food shortage? Yes. Will it be inside farming in greenhouses? Honestly, I can't say for sure, which is why the Department commissioned the Palmetto Agribusiness Council to perform a study on controlled environment agriculture. The study began last fall, and we expect to learn the results later this month. My visit to the Netherlands was part of this exploration.

It's exciting to think about where technological innovation can take us in agriculture, and many South Carolina farmers are already using methods that would have been unrecognizable a generation ago. Controlled environment growing won't be for everyone, but I think it will continue to play a greater role in specialty crops.

One thing's for sure: the Dutch have figured out how to do more with less, and that should be an inspiration to us all.
