Compared to last week: Feeder steers steady to 2.00 higher. Feeder heifers 1.00-4.00 higher. Demand good, quality average with a few attractive. Steer calves not well tested, heifer calves lightly tested with a higher undertone noted. After Friday's Cattle on Feed report came out, negotiated fed cattle trade volumes exploded with packers paying a little more as well. Buyers today trying to fill up inventories some before receipts dwindle down in the near future as is expected. Feeder cattle supply included 49 percent Steers, 3 percent Dairy Steers, 47 percent Heifers, and 2 percent Bulls. Feeder cattle supply over 600 lbs was 75 percent.							
Slaughter cows steady to 1.00 lower. Slaughter bulls steady to 1.00 higher. Packer demand moderate. A total of 295 cows and bulls sold with 41 percent going to packers.
