GRILLED STEAK AND WATERMELON SALAD

INGREDIENTS

- 4 beef tenderloin steaks, cut 1" thick
- 1 tsp. ground coriander
- 1 tsp. ground cumin
- 2 slices seedless watermelon, 1" thick
- Salt and pepper
- 8 cups baby arugula or spinach leaves
- ¼ cup balsamic or Italian dressing
- 1 cup cherry tomatoes, halved
- ½ cup thinly sliced red onion
- ¼ cup crumbled feta cheese

DIRECTIONS

1. Combine coriander and cumin; press evenly onto beef steaks.
2. Grill steaks 10 to 14 minutes on preheated grill. Carve into slices.
3. Combine greens with dressing; toss to coat. Divide among four plates.
4. Top salad with steak, watermelon, tomatoes, onion and cheese.



CAROLINA COUNTRY STYLE RIBS

INGREDIENTS

- 2 pounds boneless country style pork ribs
- 2 cups apple cider vinegar
- 1 cup water (cold)
- 2 tablespoons vegetable oil
- 2 tablespoons molasses
- 2 tablespoons molasses
- ¼ cup firmly packed brown sugar
- 1 tablespoon kosher salt
- 1 ½ teaspoons crushed red pepper
- ½ teaspoon cayenne

DIRECTIONS

1. Place ribs in a large bowl or resealable plastic bag, set aside.
2. In 4-cup glass measure, stir together vinegar, water, oil, molasses, salt, red pepper flakes and cayenne pepper until salt is dissolved. Remove 1/2 cup marinade; set aside.
3. Add remaining marinade to ribs; seal bag and marinate for 4 - 6 hours in the refrigerator. Remove ribs from marinade; discard marinade.
4. Prepare medium-hot fire; grill ribs over indirect heat for 50 to 60 minutes or until pork is tender and the internal temperature reaches 160° F. Baste ribs twice with reserved sauce mixture during last 15 minutes of grilling.

PEANUT GLAZED CHICKEN TENDERS

INGREDIENTS

- 1 lb. boneless, skinless chicken breast tenders
- 1 Tb. extra virgin olive oil
- ½ cup peanut butter
- ½ cup honey
- ¼ cup Larynx Lava hot sauce (from Palmetto Pepper Potions)

DIRECTIONS

1. Sauté chicken tenders and soy sauce in olive oil over medium heat, about 4-5 minutes per side, until brown and fully cooked.
2. Mix peanut butter, honey, and hot sauce over low heat until well combined.
3. Serve chicken with dipping sauce. This dish makes an easy and delicious appetizer.

LOOKING AT THE HARVEST AHEAD

The United States Department of Agriculture's (USDA) National Agriculture Statistics Service (NASS) released its latest crop report last month. The August report does a couple of things: it provides our first update since a number of major crops were planted; and it assesses the quality and prospects of crop yields. The numbers for several crops look good, and I'm optimistic for South Carolina and for the nation as a whole.

Corn production in the US is predicted to be down less than 1 percent from 2017. Yields in 2018 are expected to average more than 178 bushels per acre, which would have been unheard of as just five or 10 years ago. If achieved, this would be the highest yield on record. Corn numbers looks good for South Carolina, as well. Last year, we planted 350,00 acres and yielded 136 bushels per acre. This year should be about the same for our farmers. I'm already hearing about impressive initial yields from SC—including my nephew Landrum and others nearby.

Soybean production in the US is predicted to be 4.59 billion bushels -up 4 percent from 2017. This increase has a lot to do with market conditions during the time of planting; I always say our farmers "vote" with the number of acres they plant. Soybeans are planted on more acres than any other crop in our state, with 400,000

acres planted last year and 420,000 this year. Who knows – maybe one day we'll get to a half-million. Several decades back, South Carolina farmers planted over 1.5 million acres of beans.

United States **cotton** production – also a reflection of the markets – is down by 8 percent from 2017. In South Carolina, there have been some good pricing opportunities the last couple of months, and the cotton yield is expected to average 911 pounds per harvested acre. This is up 6 pounds from last year. In 2017, we planted 250,000 acres of cotton, and this year we planted 285,000 acres. We will see plenty of two- and three-bale cotton this year from fields planted in ideal moisture and unstressed.

Peanut numbers are down by about 20 percent this year, and again, this volatility reflects what farmers see in the market. Peanut booking prices and opportunities are less per ton this year than last year. Our growers had a record year in 2017, planting more than 120,000 acres of peanuts. This year, they planted about 95,000 acres. In the US we expect to see just below 1.5 million acres of peanuts harvested. As long as the farmers can stay on their spray schedule, the potential yields should be very impressive.

It's always fascinating to see the movement

WANT TO SERVE UNIQUE ITEMS? TRY “QUAIL GATING”

With football season already in gear, fans are looking for new and different tail-gating foods. After all, food is a big part of the day. Whether your team wins or loses, your guests will remember the awesome eats you served.

These quail dishes are extremely popular for almost any occasion, but try some of them for “quail gating.”

BACON WRAPPED QUAIL

PREP TIME: 5 MINUTES • COOK TIME: 25 MINUTES
SERVES 14

INGREDIENTS

- 2 jalapeños, divided use
- 1 lb Black Pepper Bacon, divided use
- 1 pkg. Frozen Quail Breasts, thawed and breasts split
- 1 tsp kosher salt
- ½ cup artisan Cheddar Cheese, shredded
- ¼ cup shallots, minced
- 1 Tb. garlic, minced
- ¼ cup bourbon, optional
- 2 Tb. maple syrup
- 2 Tb. Dijon mustard
- 3 Tb. apple cider vinegar
- 2 Tb. salted butter

DIRECTIONS

1. Preheat oven to 450°F, or if grilling, preheat grill to medium-high.
2. Cut 1 jalapeño into 14 strips, and cut 7 slices of bacon in half.
3. To prepare quail: season each breast with salt then top with 1 strip of jalapeño and some shredded cheese. Fold breast over then wrap entire breast with ½ piece of bacon. Secure with a skewer or toothpick. Continue until all breasts are wrapped. Place on a lined baking sheet and bake or grill 20 minutes.
4. Meanwhile, dice 4 to 5 slices of uncooked bacon and place in a skillet over medium-high heat. Cook several minutes to allow some fat to render out and the bacon to begin to crisp.
5. Finely dice remaining jalapeño then add to bacon along with minced shallots and garlic. Cook 2 minutes, stirring occasionally.
6. Add bourbon and carefully set on fire (using a stick lighter) to allow alcohol to cook off. Once alcohol has cooked off, stir in maple syrup, mustard, and apple cider vinegar. Bring to a simmer for 1 minute, remove from heat and quickly stir in butter.
7. Serve sauce in a small bowl next to quail.



Or, for delectable quail bites without the work, simply stop by Manchester Farms office Monday through Friday, 8 a.m. – 5 p.m. to pick up frozen quail breasts or legs. The quail pieces are pre-wrapped in bacon.

“Just throw them on the grill or oven or smoker from frozen. Easy peesy! No recipe needed. Just one box and cook,” said Matt Miller of Manchester Farms.

“We have a bacon wrapped quail product that is cooked from frozen; we do all the work for you. We take our marinated quail breasts and cut them into halves or thirds (depending on the size). Then we wrap a half strip of hickory smoked bacon around each piece, and we individually quick freeze them in our blast freezer,” Matt said.

The frozen quail are so much easier to prepare, he added. “You just take them from the freezer and put them on the grill, in the oven or on a smoker and cook until the bacon reaches your desired crispiness.”

MANCHESTER FARM HOT QUAIL SLIDERS WITH WHITE BBQ SAUCE

INGREDIENTS

- 1 tablespoon cayenne pepper
- 1 teaspoon paprika
- ½ teaspoon garlic powder
- 2 Tb. sugar, divided
- ½ cup peanut oil
- 10 Manchester Farms Boneless Quail Breast
- 3 cups buttermilk
- 3 cups self-rising flour
- 2 ½ tsp. kosher salt

FOR WHITE BBQ SAUCE

- 1 cup mayonnaise
- 1/3 cup apple cider vinegar
- 3 teaspoons water
- 1 teaspoon Worcestershire sauce
- ½ teaspoon kosher salt
- ½ teaspoon garlic powder
- ½ teaspoon onion powder
- ½teaspoon freshly ground black pepper
- ¼ teaspoon hot sauce

- 10 slider buns
- 1 cup dill pickle chips

DIRECTIONS

1. Stir together cayenne pepper, paprika, garlic powder, and 1 tablespoon of the sugar in a small saucepan. Whisk in peanut oil and cook over low, whisking constantly, until well combined, about 5 minutes. Set aside.
2. Place quail in buttermilk and let stand for 30 minutes.
3. Pour oil to depth of 1 1/2 inches into a small Dutch oven; heat over medium heat to 325°.
4. Stir together flour and salt in a medium bowl. Dredge quail in flour, shaking off any excess flour.
5. Cook in hot oil for 4 to 5 minutes, or until golden brown and crispy. Gently toss quail in cayenne pepper mixture, and divide evenly among bottom half of buns. Top with pickles and White BBQ sauce and top half of buns. Serve immediately with remaining BBQ Sauce and pickles.

FOR WHITE BBQ SAUCE

Stir together mayonnaise, vinegar, water, Worcestershire sauce, salt, garlic powder, onion powder, pepper, and hot sauce in a small bowl. Serve immediately or chilled. Refrigerate up to 3 days.



BOILED PEANUTS

No tailgate in South Carolina is complete without boiled peanuts!

The characteristics of boiled peanuts are different from those processed by any other method. The kernels have a firm, slightly gelatinous texture, and are moist with a mild flavor.

Preparation: Wash and place in-shell peanuts in a suitable container and cover with a medium brine: 10 ounces salt to one gallon of water. Use about twice as much water as peanuts. Place a weighted plate on the peanuts to keep them submerged. Soak overnight.

Add water as needed to cover the peanuts. Cook by one of the following methods:

Stove Top: Bring the peanuts to a boil; reduce heat to simmer and continue to cook for 4 hours. Add to cooking time in 30 minute increments if softer peanuts are desired. Allow to remain in brine to increase saltiness. Drain and serve.

Slow Cooker: Cook soaked peanuts on low for 8 hours and then on high for 1 1/2 hours. Test for doneness; increase cooking time as needed. Drain and serve hot or allow to cool.

Peanuts can be stored in the refrigerator for several days or frozen indefinitely.
