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## SALT LIFE

### OYSTER FARMING WITH BLUFFTON'S MAY RIVER OYSTER CO.

Andrew and Austin Harter's boat cuts through the smooth morning water of the May River near the town of Bluffton. Patchy clouds overhead keep the July heat at bay. Groups of dolphins crisscross the wide river, their dorsal fins rising periodically out of the water. "Best office in the world," says Austin.

He and his brother own the May River Oyster Co., one of seven floating-cage oyster farming operations in South Carolina.

The Harter brothers used to harvest wild oysters. These days, they grow them in underwater cages that are tethered to the bottom of the May River with huge screws placed by divers. These farmed oysters start as oyster seed — tiny oysters bought from a hatchery in Beaufort. Over the next nine to 24 months, they grow to maturity inside these cages — first inside fine mesh bags, then in coarser bags as the oysters get bigger.

"We get a great flush of fresh ocean water every day," says Andrew, describing the site he and his brother lease from the state, where they've placed nearly 200 oyster cages. "In South Carolina, we have big tides. ... It's a lot of movement."

The farmed oysters are washed by those tides while remaining constantly submerged. Given enough space in their cages and enough moving water, they grow hard shells with deep cups. The oysters inside are large, and wonderfully sweet and briny.

South Carolina's wild oysters, meanwhile, grow together along the edges of tidal rivers, often exposed to the air at low tide. They grow long, shallow shells, and they form clusters.

While wild clusters are good for roasts, Andrew says — some South Carolinians even prefer them — raw bars want singles with a certain shape.

"From a restaurant side of it, clusters aren't as good. They're soft, and hard to shuck; there's lots of loss. These are raised to be shucked and eaten raw."

Oyster farming can also allow for year-round harvest — with certain restrictions — whereas state law requires wild harvesters to take the summer off.

The Harters sell regularly to seven restaurant clients. One chef who uses their product regularly is Brandon Carter, executive chef of FARM, Bluffton's premier farm-to-table restaurant, and one of five South Carolina Chef Ambassadors for 2019.

A young industry in the Palmetto State, oyster farming has stirred up some recent controversy, with some South Carolinians worried the farms would be unsightly and impede boaters.

Given those concerns, it's surprising to see how low-profile the Harters' operation is: Just two lines of black floats marking the tops of the cages, with a few buoys. Their farm is permitted not just by DHEC and DNR, but also by the Army Corps of Engineers, who ensure the area remains navigable.

Oyster farming proponents also note that the practice is good for the marine environment. Oysters feed on phytoplankton, filtering the ocean water as they do. The cages provide a habitat for blue crabs, fish and other creatures. And farming doesn't deplete wild oyster populations.

"Farming is more sustainable," Andrew says. "You don't pull from the wild."

For now, the May River Oyster Co. is focused on fulfilling demand while maintaining quality.

"We're pretty close to the maximum of me and my brother's capabilities," Austin says. "This is every bit of a full-time job."

## SUMMER SCHOOL — AGRICULTURAL STYLE

I spent some time last week with a great group of high-school students who hope to study agriculture in college — and I can tell you that the future of agriculture in South Carolina looks bright.

Thirty-six students attended the 16<sup>th</sup> annual South Carolina Commissioner's School for Agriculture this year. You've probably read a few times about this partnership between Clemson University and the South Carolina Department of Agriculture. Each year, we get a chance to introduce a group of rising 11<sup>th</sup> and 12<sup>th</sup> grade students to the study of agriculture and natural resources. Our goal is to keep the brightest minds in agriculture in South Carolina to help lead our industry in the future.

In their week at Clemson, the students attended sessions on everything from South Carolina's agricultural history to precision agriculture technology to cotton experiments on the International Space Station.

As it is every year, the athletic turfgrass session was a big hit. Mike Echols, Clemson's supervisor of athletic grounds, is the man who keeps the grass at Memorial Stadium (better known as "Death Valley") looking smooth and green — and he taught the students that managing turf is a complicated affair. Sod farming is big business in South Carolina, and the science behind keeping turf looking perfect for gameday is continuing to grow.

Students also spent a day touring some agricultural industries, with visits to poultry producers Amick Farms, peach growers Titan Farms, Log Creek Timber, and Yon Family Farms. My thanks to those farmers for taking the time to host them.

There was time for fun, too, and plenty of outdoor activities — a rafting trip, some shooting sports, games on Bowman Field, and daily athletic challenges to start each day.

On Thursday night, I joined the students for a farm-to-table dinner at Musser Farm, the 240-acre research farm where Clemson conducts most of its peach research — a beautiful setting, and a great backdrop for enjoying some South Carolina-grown produce and food products. It's important to "walk the walk," encouraging budding farmers to invest in their state through the food they put on their plates. By the final night of the week-long school, the kids are running on fumes.

I also attended the farewell reception and awards ceremony.

We expect to see those 36 students again in March, when we'll hold a reunion in Columbia, including an ice cream social and a tour of the State Farmers Market. It's always exciting to see how the friendships that these students form at Commissioner's School thrive long after the week is done.
