#### ONWARD AND UPWARD

FAST-GROWING VERTICAL ROOTS EXPANDS TO MIDLANDS

On a recent Wednesday, Vertical Roots' new West Columbia facility was a hive of activity. And "hive" is no idle metaphor: The facility is modular, built from retired refrigerated shipping containers joined together around a central spine, with some containers dedicated to growing, some to processing, and some to storage. It feels like being inside a very clean organism — or a beehive.

In each container, something is happening. A pair of team members are cleaning out and sanitizing a container after harvest to make it ready for new transplants. Another is up on a ladder applying expanding foam to seal the new suite. A crew is packing living lettuces, roots and all, into clamshell containers for wholesale to Publix. Outside, a farmer from Ridgeway's Crazy Chic Heritage Farm is picking

up bags of discarded lettuces,

a donation for her hogs. Vertical Roots grows lettuces — six varieties plus arugula — and it's actually one of three vertically integrated companies: Tiger Corner Farms, which builds the hydroponic shipping container farms; Boxcar Central, a tech company that designs cloud-based software and control systems that automate the farms; and Vertical Roots, all of which roll up under parent company AmplifiedAg, which handles business development and marketing for all three.

they reach shelves within 24 hours of harvest, aided by their location.

Each shipping container operates on its own five-ton HVAC unit, with an automated system controlling everything from lighting to temperature to hydroponic dosing. Each tray of lettuce seedlings is labeled and logged into the system, with lettuces tracked through their lifespan. Keeping each pod

autonomous is important to food safety, allowing for quick containment of any problems should they arise.

The new site also offers opportunities for agritourism: Eventually, the Columbia facility will offer tours like at the company's Charleston facility, with a small tour fee donated to local charities.

"This is an opportunity to bring another element of agriculture to the Farmers Market site," Wheat says.

The company now has more than 100 employees between its two sites, and many of them don't come from an agriculture background — they're young people new to the industry who are drawn the company's values, Wheat says.

"We're able to get people into and interested in farming," Wheat says.

## **READING, WRITING** – **AND AGRICULTURE**

espite Labor Day having passed, it still feels like summer here in South Carolina. But back-toschool season is a good time to get students involved with agriculture inside and outside the classroom. Teaching young people about farming is important not just to encourage careers in agriculture, but to raise awareness across our culture of fresh food and the people who grow it.

#### SC FARM TO SCHOOL

The Farm to School initiative (scfarmtoschool. com) connects school food service with local farms, helping expose students to healthy, local foods. In South Carolina, participating schools commit to practices like serving Certified SC Grown produce in the cafeteria or integrating nutrition and local food education into the classroom. The program is a partnership between SCDA, the SC Department of Education, DSS, and Clemson, and offers resources like the South Carolina Garden Toolkit.

#### **AGINTHE CLASSROOM**

South Carolina Farm Bureau's Ag in the Classroom (scfb.org) provides hands-on experiences for students in grades K-12, promoting awareness of farms and farmers. The program offers free teacher resources, training, and mini-grants for teachers. One of its newest initiatives is the Book of the Month program, which offers

subscribers an agriculturethemed book and related lesson plans every month.

#### 4-H

4-H is a hands-on learning program for young people. There were about 104,000 4-H members in South Carolina last year, a 22 percent increase over the past three years. In South Carolina, Clemson Extension handles the 4-H Youth Development Program; visit 4-h.org to find the closest 4-H club to you. As I was, you may have been involved in 4-H as a young person. My best memory was getting out of school to participate in dairy cow shows in fairs across the state.

#### **FFA**

You're probably familiar with those signature blue corduroy FFA jackets. FFA, formerly called Future Farmers of America, is a leadership organization for students pursuing careers in agriculture and related fields. To join FFA, students must be enrolled in an agriculture course; the national FFA website recommends students talk to a teacher or school counselor about joining or starting a chapter. I appreciate getting to know the state officer team each year.

We look forward to a great school year and we hope teachers, parents and students will look for ways to engage with agriculture throughout the year ahead.

## **USDA TO MEASURE SMALL GRAIN PRODUCTION**

BY U.S. DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE

**ATHENS, GA** – During the first two weeks of September, growers of small grains around the country will receive survey forms from the U.S. Department of Agriculture's National Agricultural Statistics Service (NASS). The agency is taking a comprehensive look into the 2019 production and supply of small grains, which include wheat, oats, and rye.

"The small grains industry is a big player in agriculture and it is crucial for us to have accurate data about this key sector of the economy," said NASS Southern Regional Director Jacqueline Moore. "We will contact close to 4,000 producers in the Southern region (Alabama, Florida, Georgia, and South Carolina) to accurately measure 2019 acreage, yield, and production for small grains. The data collected from this survey will also help set small grain acreage and production estimates at the county level."

NASS will contact survey participants to gather information on their 2019 production and the

quantities of whole grains stored on farm. As an alternative to mailing the survey back and to help save both time and money, growers will have the option to respond to the survey securely online. Farmers who have not responded by August 30 may be contacted for a telephone or personal interview by a National Association of State Departments of Agriculture (NASDA) enumerator.

NASS safeguards the privacy of all respondents and publishes only aggregate data, ensuring that no individual operation or producer can be identified.

Survey results will be published in several reports, including the annual Small Grains Summary and the quarterly Grain Stocks report, both to be released on September 30. 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

## 7<sup>TH</sup> GENERATION SC FARMER BALANCES PEANUTS, TOBACCO, HEMP

Neal Baxley's peanuts were about 20 days out from harvest, but he said he didn't mind pulling up a few plants to show some visitors from the SC Department of Agriculture. He wanted to see how they looked.

He pointed to bumps along the roots of a Virginia-type variety, evidence of a beneficial bacteria used to inoculate the plants to help them create their own nitrogen. He brushed the sandy soil off a peanut shell. When it comes to Virginia peanuts, he said, the buyers like a bright color. "They want a good white hull so when they roast them, it looks good," he explained.



Neal Baxley pulls up a Virginia-type peanut plant.

Baxley grows both Virginia-type and runner-type peanuts. He describes runners as a wilder peanut that takes longer to grow but is more disease resistant. "Virginia peanuts are divas; you've got to treat them nice."

In addition to peanuts, Baxley's Marion County acreage is planted with tobacco, which he sells to Santa Fe Natural Tobacco Company, and hemp, among other crops.

Baxley was one of the initial 20 farmers authorized by the South Carolina Department of Agriculture to grow hemp for the 2018 season, so he's now in his second year of growing hemp. His approach has been a bit different from what he saw on exploratory visits to other hemp-growing states.

"The way I'm growing hemp, they said in other states you couldn't do it that way. I'm growing it

like tobacco. I figure hemp is a weed, tobacco is a weed."

He employs 14 farmworkers from Mexico through the federal H-2A program, which authorizes temporary laborers to work in U.S. agricultural jobs, with employers like Baxley providing housing, transportation, and other services in addition to wages.

So far this year, the workers have stayed busy harvesting cucumbers and hand-cropping tobacco leaves. When hemp harvest time comes, they'll hand-crop it as well.

Baxley stays active, serving on the South Carolina Pork Board, the 2019 Peanut Leadership Academy, and SC Farm Bureau's State Board, hemp advisory board,

and tobacco advisory board. He was formerly an alternate on the National Peanut Board for South Carolina. He keeps learning and experimenting, too — adjusting acreage, trying new things.

"My family are at least seventh-generation farmers," he says.



# GOING ORGANIC? COST SHARE GRANT CAN HELP FARMERS, FOOD PROCESSORS

**COLUMBIA** – South Carolina farmers and food processors who want to pursue organic certification may qualify for reimbursement through a grant administered by the South Carolina Department of Agriculture.

"These organic cost share grants are a valuable tool for farmers looking to expand to new markets," said Commissioner of Agriculture Hugh Weathers. "SCDA is happy to help ease the financial burden of organic certification for South Carolina agribusinesses."

Eric McClam is co-owner of the Columbia farm City Roots, which participated in the reimbursement program in previous years.

"The organic cost share reimbursement makes getting certified organic more financially achievable for all types and sizes of farmers," McClam said. "It has allowed us to recoup the costs associated with organic certification, which we in turn utilize to

produce more food for our community in South Carolina."

The Organic Certification Cost Share Program will reimburse producers and handlers of agricultural products up to 75 percent of the operation's total allowable certification costs, up to a maximum of \$750 per certification scope: crops, livestock, wild crops, and handling (i.e., processing). The deadline to apply for reimbursement for the current fiscal year is October 31, 2019.

SCDA also has three other cost share reimbursement programs available as projects of the USDA Specialty Crop Block Grant Program, including one that offsets the cost of installing an affordable Cool Bot cold storage unit; and two that support businesses through the Good Agricultural Practices (GAP) Audit process.
