These cattle are indentified as Value Added. The next Special Angus sale will be December 7, 2020. Quality showed the complete range of plain through attractive. Slaughter cattle prices finally made it to the century mark last week but still lag behind the current futures contract. Beef prices moved over 2.00 higher than the previous week. Supply included: 100% Feeder Cattle (54% Steers, 45% Heifers, 2% Bulls. Feeder cattle Supply over 600 lbs was 71%. Compared to last week: Slaughter cows sold 5.00-10.00 lower. Slaughter bulls 9.00-10.00 lower. Demand moderate.
