Masks

- All workers and vendors will be encouraged to wear masks while on Market grounds.
- All attendees will be highly encouraged to wear masks.
- Complimentary masks to be available and given out at information booth.
- Mask signage posted on Market grounds.

Social Distancing

- Signs will be in place to promote social distancing and hand washing.
- Only one employee will man the /SCDA information booth. No materials or "freebies" will be distributed.

Cleaning/Sanitizing

- Restrooms will be monitored and cleaned every hour.
- Will follow CDC guidelines and restrict the number of people in restroom at a given time.
- Hand sanitizing stations will be placed throughout the event area.

Vendor Expectations/Communications

- Letters mailed to vendors highlighting CDC guidelines and detailed expectations of vendors during the event.
- Require Arts and Crafts Vendors to wear gloves; provide hand sanitizer stations for attendees/customers; and, encourage vendors to hold their products to show to customers to discourage customers from picking up items.
- Poster signs at entrance to the market and key locations outlining the precautions that are being taken for attended health and safety.
- All Marketing of the event to include what steps are being taken by the market and the vendors in addition to what is required of all attendees.

Promotional Information/Communications with Public
