## MAJOR PEANUT SHELLING FACILITY TO OPEN IN ORANGEBURG COUNTY

Georgia-based Premium Peanut announced plans last week to invest \$64.3 million to open South Carolina's first major peanut shelling facility.

It's been a long time coming. Ken Middleton, chairman of the Orangeburg County Development Commission, says he told a farmer friend about

product here and shipping it somewhere else for processing," Weathers explained. "And we'll need more acreage to supply the new facility."

Premium Peanut is farmer-owned, noted President and CEO Karl Zimmer.



the new operation. "He said, 'Man, we've been waiting on that for years,'" Middleton told a crowd assembled at the Palmetto Peanut buying point in Cameron, South Carolina.

South Carolina's status as a peanut producer has grown dramatically over the past two decades, ever since Congress scrapped the old peanut quota system, allowing the Palmetto State to expand peanut acreage.

But South Carolina peanut growers have largely sold their peanuts to out-of-state shellers. Having a shelling operation in Orangeburg County will keep more dollars in the state and expand opportunities for farmers, explained Commissioner of Agriculture Hugh Weathers.

"When an agricultural processor comes to South Carolina, it is value added. We're not just growing a

peanut butter manufacturers domestically, as well as customers in more than 30 countries around the world.

Zimmer says when he started the company, he joked about giving his wife a list of the peanut butter brands she was allowed to buy at the grocery store because they were Premium Peanut customers.

"Today, you can buy whatever one you want because they're all ours," he said.

The location of the Orangeburg facility has not been announced, but the facility is projected to create 130 jobs.

The company has a current shelling capacity of 300,000 tons, which is about 10% of the nation's peanut crop. They're looking to South Carolina to expand capacity.

## ON SC'S FARMER OF THE YEAR

South Carolina's Farmer of the Year is a role model for strength through diversification.

Robert "Bob" Martin Hall owns Bush-N-Vine Farm in York, South Carolina. He's the Swisher/Sunbelt Expo Farmer of the Year awardee for South Carolina, and has a chance at the Southeastern Farmer of the Year title at this year's expo. Bob would be the fourth Palmetto State farmer to win it all.

Hall's family farm used to be a peach orchard, but starting in 1979, Bob built it into a diversified fruit and vegetable farm. These days, Bush-N-Vine is a uniquely South Carolina place, supporting indoor and outdoor growing, two farm stands and a farm store, a Community-Supported Agriculture operation with over 2,500 shares, U-pick activities, and strong social media and online presence.

Just a few years back I attended the grand opening of their new expanded market building. I was as proud as all the members of three generations of the Hall family to see what they had built.

Bob Hall has a quality common to most successful farmers: After carefully the weighing pros and cons, he's always willing to try something new. He and his family grow flowers, berries, peaches, melons, and a wide variety of seasonal vegetables

year-round. Those Bush-N-Vine strawberries are famously sweet!

He's also a great ambassador for the Certified South Carolina program, helping consumers eat a variety of fresh local produce and championing direct-to-consumer sales. And as a member of the South Carolina Agritourism Association and the South Carolina Specialty Crop Association, Bob finds other ways to reach the public – and serves his fellow South Carolina farmers, too.

A small contingent from the South Carolina Department of Agriculture will be attending this year's Sunbelt Ag Expo in Moultrie, Georgia. We wish Bob good luck in the big competition – but here in the Palmetto State, we already know he's a winner.

I'm on the road a lot in September, including visiting farms, speaking at a dinner at Titan Farms in Ridge Spring featuring South Carolina Chef Ambassador Jason Tufts.

Later, I'll be attending the National Association of State Departments of Agriculture meeting in Louisville, Kentucky. I'm on a NASDA steering committee this year, focusing on the future of our national organization. I expect a policy-packed conference given everything that's happening in Washington right now. As always, I will keep you posted.

## DOES YOUR BUSINESS BUY SOUTH CAROLINA AGRICULTURAL PRODUCTS?

STATE TAX CREDIT MAY APPLY TO YOU

Buying local could pay off for your business at tax time.

South Carolina provides a possible income tax credit or withholding tax credit to agribusinesses or agricultural packaging operations that increase their purchases of products certified as grown in South Carolina by the South Carolina Department of Agriculture.

The program is intended to reward existing companies for buying more agricultural products grown in South Carolina.

To be eligible for this credit, a company must have a base year in which the company purchases more than \$100,000 of agricultural products that have been certified as grown in South Carolina by the South Carolina Department of Agriculture, and

then must increase the number of agricultural units purchased in the following year by at least 15% over base-year unit totals.

Eligible companies may claim an income tax credit or a credit against employee withholding as decided by the South Carolina Coordinating Council for Economic Development. An individual taxpayer may not be awarded a credit in excess of \$100,000 during any calendar year, and the maximum amount of tax credits allowed to all qualifying taxpayers may not exceed \$2,000,000.

# NEARLY \$300,000 IN GRANT FUNDING NOW AVAILABLE FOR PROJECTS AIMED AT REDUCING DIESEL ENGINE EMISSIONS

The South Carolina Department of Health and Environmental Control (DHEC) announced that grant funding is now available for the replacement or upgrade of older diesel engines in an effort to help reduce diesel emissions across the state.

Diesel emissions make up a significant portion of the mobile source air pollution in South Carolina, however, roughly \$294,000 in federal funding from the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency's 2021 State Diesel Emissions Reduction Act (DERA) grant will help South Carolina support clean diesel projects.

"Recent data shows that diesel engines account for a majority of harmful emissions from both on-road and off-road equipment," said Rhonda Thompson, DHEC's Bureau of Air Quality Chief. "This funding will support projects that target older diesel engines and will reduce their harmful effects on public health and the environment."

DERA funding is intended for county, city, or other local government entities, private organizations, businesses, and universities. Grants are awarded to eligible applicants for the implementation of diesel emissions reduction projects which achieve public health and air quality goals. These projects should be cost-effective plans to reduce emissions through engine repowers, equipment and exhaust retrofits, or equipment replacements. EPA will share between 25 percent and 100 percent of the costs, depending on the type of project.

Previously allocated DERA grant funding has been used to replace school buses, repower a marine vessel, and retrofit emergency response vehicles.

"DERA continues to support innovative projects that improve air quality for the people in South Carolina," said Thompson.

The Request for Proposal (RFP) will be released on October 1, 2021. ## FUNDING AVAILABLE TO HELP WITH ORGANIC CERTIFICATION

COLUMBIA – South Carolina farmers and food processors who want to pursue organic certification may qualify for reimbursement through a grant administered by the South Carolina Department of Agriculture.

"Organic certification can open up new market opportunities for South Carolina farmers and companies," said Commissioner of Agriculture Hugh Weathers. "Our cost share grant programs are a great use of public funds because they support agribusinesses that have 'skin in the game' by paying back a portion of their investment."

The Organic Certification Cost Share Program will reimburse producers and handlers of agricultural products up to 50 percent of the operation's total allowable certification costs, up to a maximum of \$500 per certification scope: crops, livestock, wild crops, and handling (i.e., processing). The deadline to apply for reimbursement for the current fiscal year is December 10, 2021.

SCDA also has three other cost share reimbursement programs available as projects of the USDA Specialty Crop Block Grant Program, including one that offsets the cost of installing an affordable Cool Bot cold storage unit; and two that support businesses through the Good Agricultural Practices (GAP) Audit process.
