Compared to last week: Feeder steers unevenly steady. Feeder heifers 2.00-4.00 higher. Steer and heifer calves steady to 3.00 higher. Demand remains very good for calves and stocker cattle despite the continued very dry weather. Strong feeder futures in the out front months is boosting demand for light weight cattle. Quality average to attractive. Supply included: 100% Feeder Cattle (58% Steers, 41% Heifers, 1% Bulls). Feeder cattle supply over 600 lbs was 50%.									
Compared to last week: Slaughter cows steady to 2.00 higher. Slaughter bulls 3.00-6.00 higher. Demand was good. Supply included several fancy cows from a reputation ranch in Oklahoma. A total of 741 cows and bulls sold with 63 percent going to packers. Supply included: 43% Feeder Cattle (100% Steers); 33% Slaughter Cattle (92% Cows, 8% Bulls); 24% Replacement Cattle (97% Bred Cows, 3% Cow-Calf Pairs). Feeder cattle supply over 600 lbs was 0%.
