Heifer calves lightly tested and under 500 lbs 8.00 to 10.00 higher; over 500 lbs sold 3.00 lower. Demand moderate to good for all classes. Supply included: 100% Feeder Cattle (62% Steers, 35% Heifers, 3% Bulls). Feeder cattle supply over 600 lbs was 59%.								May
