Compared to last week: Feeder steers 2.00-5.00 lower. Feeder heifers 3.00-6.00 lower. Demand moderate to good for feeder cattle but quality plain to mostly average. Steer and heifer calves steady to 5.00 higher. Demand good for calves. Weather remains warm for the start of October, however a cool front with rain is expected midweek. This will drop temperatures back into the low 70's and night time temps into the mid 40's. Farmers remain busy planting wheat. As of the last week of September, less than 20 percent of the wheat crop was planted. Supply included: 100% Feeder Cattle (55% Steers, 41% Heifers, 3% Bulls). Feeder cattle supply over 600 lbs was 60%.									
Compared to last week: Slaughter cows 3.00-5.00 lower. Slaughter bulls 6.00 lower. Packer demand moderate to good. Fall culling has begun with several bunches of slaughter cows included. Demand continues good for bred cows and pairs. Supply included: 36% Feeder Cattle (100% Steers); 47% Slaughter Cattle (94% Cows, 6% Bulls); 17% Replacement Cattle (20% Bred Cows, 56% Bred Heifers, 23% Cow-Calf Pairs). Feeder cattle supply over 600 lbs was 0%.
