Compared to last week: Feeder steers and heifers 4.00-8.00 lower, some later heifer sales up to 15.00 lower. Demand light to moderate as cattle futures closed sharply lower following a very Bearish Cattle on Feed Report last Friday. Steer calves 2.00-4.00 lower, except few under 500 lbs. long weaned or fancy sold sharply higher. Heifer calves 4.00-10.00 lower. Demand moderate to good for calves. Quality mostly average, few attractive. Supply included: 100% Feeder Cattle (57% Steers, 40% Heifers, 4% Bulls). Feeder cattle supply over 600 lbs. was 63%.											
Compared to last week: Slaughter cows mostly steady. Slaughter bulls 3.00-4.00 lower. Packer Demand moderate. Bred Cows and pairs were limited. Bulk of the replacement numbers were young open cows or heifers.											
Supply included: 51% Feeder Cattle (100% Steers); 38% Slaughter Cattle (93% Cows, 7% Bulls); 11% Replacement Cattle (58% Bred Cows, 25% Bred Heifers, 17% Cow-Calf Pairs). Feeder cattle supply over 600 lbs was 0%.
